Jones Takes College Post**

Edward Markey of Massena, New York will be the head basketball coach at McQuaid Jesuit High this year.

Markey will replace Ken Jones, who leaves McQuaid after five years to move up to a coaching post at Keene State (N.H.) College.

**Gears Chosen  
To Head RBA**

Harold "Shifty" Gears, the former softball great, was recently named president of the Rochester Bowling Association. Gears succeeds Joe Holzhuh.

The retirement of Ed Wildey who has been secretary-treasurer for the association for 27 consecutive years was announced. Milt Alt, Wildey's assistant, was elected the new secretary. Wildey will continue in the capacity of treasurer.

Arthur Messinger was elected first vice-president, Joe Alaimo, second vice-president, Al Chaplin, third vice-president, and John A. Piehler, fourth.

Directors elected, in order, were Frank Harris, Ray Woerner, Walter Lantz, and Joseph Cirrin. Alternate directors elected were Elmer Kern, Carl Lang, and Joseph Smarsh.

The new president said that plans are already under way for next year's City Championship Tournament. It will be the fiftieth annual city tournament and it is to be the largest in the association's history. The Rochester Bowling Association represents well over 800 organized ABC sanctioned leagues in the area.

The new coach comes to Rochester after six successful years at Holy Family High School in Massena, where he was athletic director, football coach and basketball coach since the school's beginning. Prior to his stint at Massena, he coached and taught at Bishop Kenny High in Jacksonville, Florida. At McQuaid, Markey will be a math instructor in addition to his basketball assignment.

Markey, married and the father of three children, is a native of Elizabeth, New Jersey. He is a graduate of Holy Cross and a veteran of three years service as a naval officer.

In announcing Markey's appointment, McQuaid rector Father Albert P. Bartlett, S.J., also announced the addition of faculty as junior varsity basketball coach and physical education instructor. McHugh, a 1962 McQuaid graduate and a standout in football and baseball during his scholastic years, is presently completing his Master's degree at Ithaca College.

Ken Jones' five year tenure as McQuaid basketball mentor was featured by two successive diocesan championships in 1964 and 1965. Two of his stars were named High School All-Americans: Tony Leonardo in '65 and John Koller in '67. He directs his own basketball camp for boys - 12-18 years of age each-summer.

His new post at Keene State College will be head basketball coach and assistant professor of physical education at the New Hampshire school.

**Equipment, Curriculum  
Changes Set at RBI**

Equipment and curriculum changes are to result in a broader educational program for students in Data Processing at the Rochester Business Institute. Robert E. Veigel, RBI President announced this week. The changes will be effective during the 1967-68 school year.

Having now one of the first IBM Computer Systems installed in Rochester, the school will soon be replacing its Model 30 system with a new System/360 Model 20. The new computer will have among its components the IBM multi-function card machine, and the reproducer with that of punched card entry to a computer system. These functions formerly required the used of four separate machines.

Programming training will be broadened in the new school year to include advanced programming languages as well as training for both disk and tape-oriented computer systems. Program testing for students has been contracted to Valldex Corporation, for Model 30 and Model 40 computers in the System/360 line. RBI students will thereby gain exposure to larger and more sophisticated computer systems, in addition to the system analysis and design. These curriculum advances will be reflected in the Computing Education Program as well as the Day School curriculum.

The new school year will also introduce in the day school a one-year program of Data Processing operations training, providing equipment operations experience with punched card machines as well as the computer system. The two-year course leading to a computer programming certificate will be continued with the improvements noted above.
