**Military Rites Accorded Major Eugene Holzauer**

Auburn — Funeral Mass for Major Eugene F. Holzauer, distinguished in military and business circles here and husband of Mrs. Dorothy Pinckney Holzauer was offered in St. Mary's Church, May 27.

Major Holzauer, 41, of Bluefield Road, died May 25, 1967 after an illness of four months.

The Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Father Timothy Donahue, O. Carm. assisted by Father Francis Donahue, O. Carm., deacon with Father Elmer W. Heindl, chaplain of the 98th Division, Father Paul J. Treemeser, chaplain of the 391st Regiment of which Major Holzauer was a member and Father Conrad Sundholm.

Full military honors were accorded the deceased with members of the Reserves, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Elks participating.

Born in Auburn, he was the son of Charles E. and Anna O'Connor Holzauer. He was a graduate of Holy Family High School and LeMoyne College.

A veteran of World War II he entered the U.S. Army after being a member of the ROTC at LeMoyne and served in the European Theater.

Mr. Holzauer was active in the U.S. Army Reserve in recent years and had attained the rank of major. He was assigned to the 391st Inf. Regt., U.S. Army Reserve in Auburn and was a past commander of the unit.

**Mrs. Snyder Receives Award**

Mrs. George A. Snyder of 607 Maple Ave., a Horseheads High School English teacher, has been selected to receive a \$1,000 award to Horseheads School District by Corning Glass Works Foundation.

The award, one of several established by the foundation to encourage and assist teachers in summer study abroad, will be used by Mrs. Snyder for that purpose.

She plans to leave July 4 for five weeks in England and Scotland as a member of a formal study program with classes at Oxford University, participating in a London symposium with prominent British authors, visits to British schools and theaters and tours of literary, historic and cultural landmarks.

She joined the Horseheads school system in 1961 and teaches 12th grade English classes.

She earned a master's degree from Elmira College in 1964. The previous summer she had participated in a State Education Department program on advanced placement at Cornell University.

Her husband is a guidance counselor at Elmira Free Academy and she is the mother of four children—three of whom were in college at the same time. One of her children, James F. Snyder, is a social studies teacher at Horseheads.

Mrs. Snyder is a former Auburn correspondent for the Courier-Journal, and from 1950 to 1960 wrote a weekly column for this paper.

He was also a member of St. Mary's Holy Name Society.

Mr. Holzauer was the founder of the Mohawk-Hornar Co. Inc., painting contractors, the Empire Construction Division of the Emco Builders Inc. He was chairman of the board for Mohawk-Hornar and president of Empire Construction.

He was chairman of the Building Industry Fund of Auburn, a member of the board of directors of the Auburn Builders Exchange, a trustee of the Finger Lakes Carpenters' Pension Welfare Fund, a member of the committee of admissions to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, a member of the Industrial Management Club of Auburn and the LeMoyne College Alumni Association.

Surviving besides his wife and parents are a son, David P. Holzauer, two brothers, Donald J. and Robert C. Holzauer, several aunts and uncles.

Burial was in St. Joseph's Cemetery where blessing was given by Father Treemeser with Father Heindl, Fathers Timothy and Francis. Arrangements by Farrell Funeral Home.

**CAUGHT IN A CRISIS**  
THE HOLY FATHER'S MISSION AID TO THE ORIENTAL CHURCH

Dear Friend:  
A true emergency has arisen. We need \$250,000 at once because our normal budget is vanishing while demands for food, clothing and medicine in our area of responsibility are skyrocketing in the face of the Arab-Israeli situation.  
Over one million refugees in the Near East are caught in that area's awful crisis.  
Half of them are children. Others are ailing, undernourished adults. Some are lepers, some deaf mutes, some blind.  
They are innocent victims. They bear no arms. Hungry, ill fed and clothed, miserably sheltered at best in the past, they are now passive, ignored pawns in a frightening tug of war.  
You know the work of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association and its Pontifical Mission for Palestine. Normally, through your help, we give basic sustenance to Near East refugees at a cost of a quarter of a million dollars a year.  
This year's budget is rapidly vanishing while our stocks of food, clothing and medicine are suddenly exhausted.  
To meet this crisis situation, we immediately need an additional \$250,000 at least for present emergencies. We call upon you—urgently—to provide a truly generous share, so we can lighten the burden of these, the least of Christ's brethren, in their darkest hour. Please respond at once. May God bless you.  
We ask your prayers for peace and the end of suffering. We ask it in God's name.
