

Fisher Summer Session Reports High Enrollment

Registrations for the 1967 Summer Session at St. John Fisher College are more than 10 per cent higher than last year, according to Dr. Charles J. Meder, director. The record enrollment shows 573 students registered for a total of 727 courses. Last year 519 students took 652 courses.

Men outnumber women slightly better than two to one in the coeducational special session, with 342 males and 167 females registered. During the regular academic year these students attend more than one hundred different colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada.

Classes began Monday (June 26) for the six-week day and evening session at Fisher.

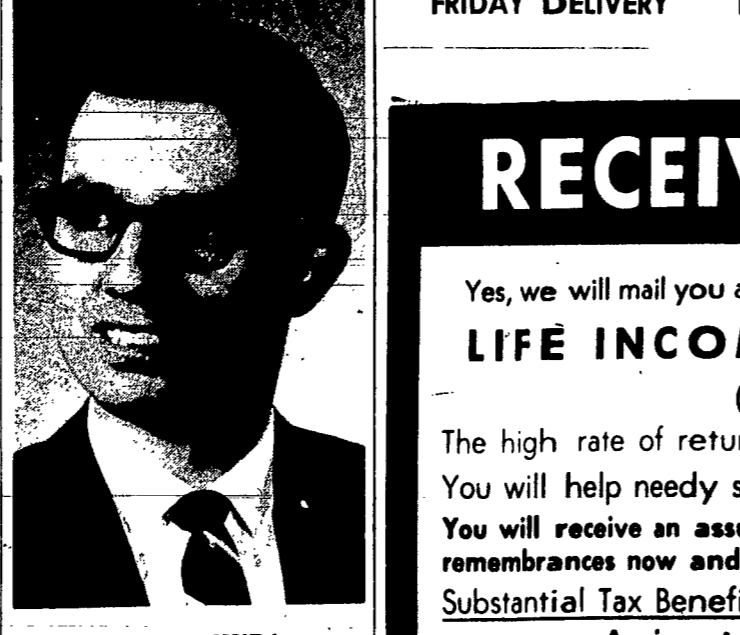
Daniel had hoped to enter St. John Fisher College last fall but in the summer after his graduation he grew worse in health and was never able to enter.

Toronto, Ont. — (RNS) — The role of the priest in the Roman Catholic Church must be studied and possibly changed for young people "won't go into the priesthood."

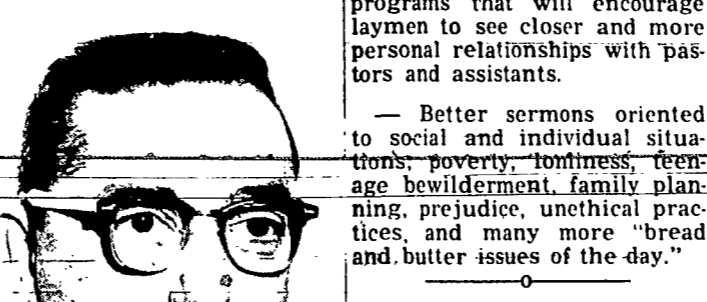

Vocations Drop in Spain

Madrid — (NC) — A sharp drop in vocations to the priesthood is causing concern here.

It was reported in a press conference held to publicize Seminary Day that in 1966 500 fewer men entered minor seminaries and 250 fewer entered major seminaries than in 1965.

The seriousness of the decrease is emphasized by recent requests for priests from Latin America and Spain's own need for parish priests.

Women in miniskirts "profess a pseudo-nonconformity," he said, but "actually resemble monkeys with their capricious extravagance."

The aping of current styles was criticized by Msgr. Ferdinando Lambruschini, a member of several Vatican congregations, and commissions and a popular writer on moral questions in L'Osservatore della Domenica, a weekly newspaper published here. He wrote in answer to a flood of letters which arrived after actress Claudia Cardinale appeared at a papal audience in a miniskirt.

He said that there is a group of people today which "has managed to impose very short dresses and to expose the female body to the utmost, apparently in order to exalt its beauty."
