

Elmira KC Track Club To Host Statewide Meet

Variety will be the keynote at the Seventh Annual New York State AAU Track and Field Championships on Saturday, July 29 at Elmira's Parker Field.

The 21-event program includes six field diversifications: six field events; six racing events around a flat course; two hurdle features (the 120 highs and the 440 intermediates); two relays; mile walk, and four girls' running events, including a 440-relay.

Field events and track time trials are scheduled for 5 p.m. with the track finals slated to follow at 7 p.m.

The donation is \$1 for adults, 50 cents for grammar school children when accompanied by an adult and preschoolers are free.

Some 200 athletes from all corners of the state are expected to take part.

Cornelius L. Sullivan and Joseph T. Limoncelli are co-chairmen.

The host Elmira K. C. Track Club team prepared for the State Meet by participating in the Track and Field Federation State Meet at Colgate University, Saturday, July 15.

Coach Glenn Mallette entered a 17-man squad in this final warm-up before the Elmira meet.



Fred Aman Authors Book On Percussion

Fred Aman, age 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Aman, 292 Marion St., a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Rochester this past June, is author of a recently published book entitled "DIRECT APPROACH TO SIGHT READING." The purpose of the book is to develop the sight reading ability of the elementary and intermediate drum student.

Aman's musical education began at the age of four when he started drum lessons with Elmer Froelich. Advanced studies in percussion were pursued at the Eastman School of Music under John Beck. In addition to being a percussionist, Fred is also a pianist, composer and arranger having studied piano and composition under Dr. Richard Egner and arranging under Rayburn Wright. One of his works was featured at last year's Arranger's Holiday.

Aman's keen interest in jazz has led to private study under Cozy Cole and Edmond Thippen as well as class instruction under Oscar Peterson and Stan Kenton. He has also served as director of music at McQuaid High School.

Though his activities in the musical world have been extensive, indeed, Fred's primary interests lie in more academic areas. At the University of Rochester, his major field of concentration was Political Science. Upon graduation he was awarded the Townsend Fellowship for showing the highest ability in this department.

Aman will begin the study of law this fall. Having received a National Honor Scholarship, he will attend the University of Chicago. At present, he is an intern at The New York State Constitutional Convention and is engaged in research for the Committee on Economic Development.

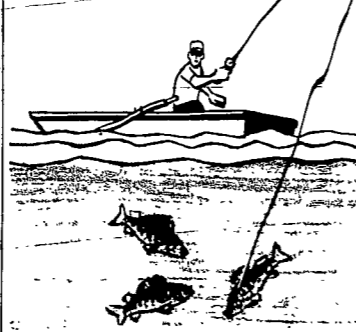

Vatican City — (NC)—Thousands of choir boys from all parts of the world massed in St. Peter's basilica to sing at a Mass offered by Pope Paul VI.

Thousands of other visitors and tourists joined the early morning Mass and heard the Prayer of the People sung in English, Italian, French, Spanish and German. At the offertory representatives of the various nations participating in the Mass presented the Pope with gifts symbolic of their country. Two French boys, both cripples, were brought to the Pope and offered their suffering for the sake of world peace.

At the end of the Mass the Pope spoke in Italian, French,

German, English and Spanish. In English he said:

"Besides singing all together you must also sing well. This is not easy — it demands much practice and hard work. But it is possible and therefore you must practice and work so as to make your singing as perfect as you can.

"Your song is your gift to God and you strive to make that gift as beautiful and attractive as it can possibly be.
