



What Jesus Looked Like

Rome — (RNS) — Prof. Lorenzo Ferri (right), an Italian scholar who has devoted 35 years to the study of Christ's physical features, points to one of his drawings of Jesus. He bases his findings on years of study in Vatican archives, the Holy Land, and Turin where is enshrined the Holy Shroud, reputed to be the cloth in which the Crucified Christ was wrapped and which bears an imprint of a human body. Prof. Ferri, a sculptor and expert in anatomy, believes Christ was six feet tall, contrary to popular belief that He was of average height. The artist has made a statue of Christ using a transparent plastic print of the Holy Shroud.

'Churchless' Mass in Homes

Louisville, Ky. — (NC) — Mass in parishioners' homes has been under way on a twice-a-week basis for nearly three months in a "churchless" parish here.

"It has done great things for the parish," according to Father William Diersen, pastor of Incarnation parish. He sought and got permission for the home Masses largely so that he could be among his parishioners and help them to know one another. Before then, Masses were celebrated in a school building.

"This rectory isn't the place to sit," Father Diersen remarked. "The day of the people coming to you is over."

Negotiate, Says Prelate

Atlanta — (NC) — Archbishop Paul J. Hallinan of Atlanta has become the third member of the U.S. Catholic hierarchy to sign a "Negotiation Now" petition asking the U.S. government to stop the bombing of North Vietnam and take steps toward a truce.

Earlier, Bishop John J. Dougherty of Newark, president of Seton Hall University, agreed to be listed among the drive's sponsors.

Among the other sponsors are Dr. Martin Luther King, theologian Reinhold Niebuhr, author William L. Shirer, and editor Norman Cousins.

THE PETITION has three main points: 1) support of United Nations Secretary U Thant's call for negotiations among all parties to the war; 2) an unconditional end to the bombing of North Vietnam by the U.S. and U.S. initiative toward a truce; 3) South Vietnamese cooperation in these steps.

In another development here related to Vietnam, a meeting of Atlanta clergy and laymen on the campus of Emory University heard Dr. Robert M. Afee Brown, religion professor at Stanford University, say U.S. churches and synagogues may have waited too long to speak out against U.S. policy in Vietnam.

"Perhaps we could have averted the deaths of thousands of Americans and hundreds of thousands of Asians," he said.

Dr. Brown, Father Philip Berigan, S.S.J., pastor of St. Peter Claver parish in Baltimore, and Rabbi Abraham L. Feinberg of Toronto spoke to the anti-war meeting.

Sunday Mass On Saturday

Superior, Wis. — (NC) — Bishop George A. Hammes of Superior has received the faculty from the Holy See to grant permission to pastors, under certain conditions, to allow Catholics in their parishes to anticipate the Sunday Mass obligation on Saturday evening. The privilege extends to visitors within a parish, and also applies to holy days.

The Saturday Mass must be celebrated after 5:00 p.m., and the Mass formulary must be that of the Sunday. As on Sunday, the celebrant is required to preach a homily and to include the prayers of the faithful at the Offertory.

In the Superior diocese, the first in Wisconsin to receive the faculty to act on this privilege, Bishop Hammes has granted it for the summer months, from Memorial Day to Labor Day, to pastors who say they need it.

In a letter to priests of the diocese, Bishop Hammes said he "requested this privilege of the Holy See for the easing of our mutual problems of giving good pastoral care to the diocese, an obligation made difficult during the tourist season."
