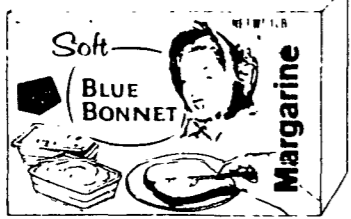

Long Island Track Club Coasts to State AAU Title

Elmira — The Long Island Athletic Club amassed a record 109 points en route to its fourth straight team title in the 7th New York State AAU Track and Field Championships recently in Elmira.

Four records were shattered and a new one established in the meet which was sponsored by the Elmira K of C Track Team.

Buffalo's Garden Town Track Club finished second with 49 points.

The New York Athletic Club, lacking relay strength but with its athletes taking four firsts, just one less than Long Island, earned a trophy for a third place finish with 32 points.

Elmira's host team earned fourth place with a strong 30-point bid.

In the girls' events, the team title went to the Clarence Track Club with 22 points, followed by the Finger Lakes T.C. with 17, the Alfred Atlantans with 3, and the Elmira K of C T.C. with 2.

In the closest balloting for the stars of the meet since 1964, Fran Smith was named the top male performer for his winning efforts in the 440 and 880 and his record-breaking anchoring of Garden Town's mile relay team.

Smith received six votes, while Barry Brown of the NYAC, with mark-shattering showings in the mile (4:11.4) and the 2-mile (9:08.6), and Henry Jackson (LI), who won the long and triple jumps, each earned five of the judges' votes.

Jackson's effort in the triple jump was sensational, as he erased the old mark by over 3/4 feet, leaping 50-7 1/2.

In a new event added this year, Wes Brooker of Long Island, posted a 54.0 in the 440 hurdles.

The new record set by Garden Town in the mile relay is 3:18.9, shattering the 3:23.4 mark of the L.I. Striders in 1966.

Brown clipped nearly two seconds from the old mile mark of Bill Ripple of Garden Town (4:13.3) in 1966 and nearly six seconds from the previous best in the 2-mile by Ron Davis of Long Island (9:14.3 in 1964).

Other fine performances were turned in by Bill Bruckel of Cornell and Avon, N.Y., who breezed to wins in the 100 and 220; Ed Mulvihill of the NYAC and Manhattan College, who captured the high jump at 6-4 and finished second in the pole vault, and little Tim St. Lawrence of the NYAC and Fordham, who thought he had a new State mark until the bar was re-measured at 14-3.

Finger Lakes Stake Events

Canandaigua — Three stakes events, two of which will be unveiled for the first time, will highlight the 39-day Fall Meeting of Finger Lakes Race Track's continuous 125-day racing season which concludes October 16.

The inaugural running of the \$5,000 added New York Breeders Juvenile Fillies Stakes is set for Saturday, September 2. Of the original 62 nominated to this 6-furlong event, 47 have

retained eligibility. The \$5,000 added Rochester Handicap, a test at a mile and one-sixteenth for three-year-olds and up, is scheduled for its initial running on Labor Day. Highlight of the entire season will be the fifth running of the \$10,000 added New York Breeders Futurity, Saturday, September 16. A record 121 New York-bred Two-year-olds were nominated to this 6-furlong classic and 82 have remained eligible.

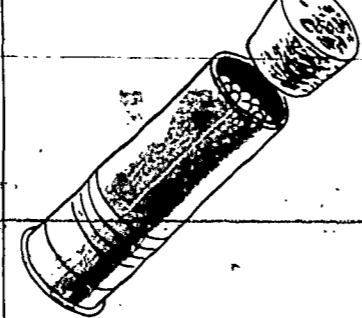
