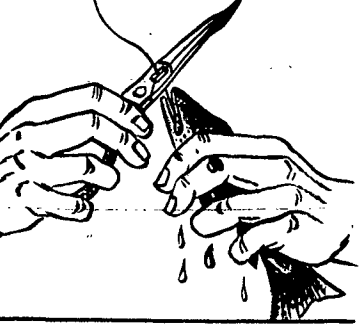
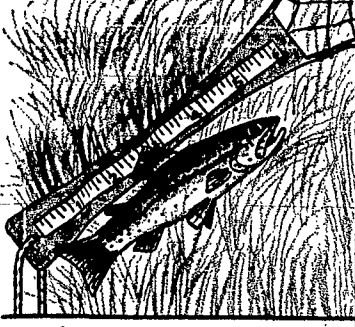

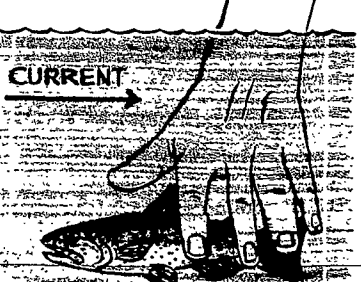

The Stadium box office will open Friday from noon to 5:30 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m.

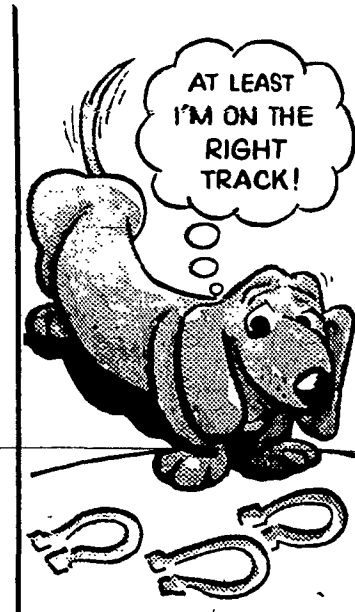
