TOO MUCH POLITICS DURING WORST RIOT NO UNIFIED APPROACH TO DETROIT PROBLEM

WASHINGTON—The political reaction to the Detroit rioting was a shabby performance all around. A Republican statement placing the blame at the White House was blatantly partisan; President Johnson's overly-cautious delay in permitting the use of U.S. troops already in the area appeared for a time to place political implications above the very real need for speedy action.

The leadership of neither political party served their followers well by thinking politically at a time of crisis. They would have done better to try to find a unified approach both to the immediate situation and to the long-range solutions which inevitably must be sought and achieved on a non-partisan basis.

Political leaders complain frequently that they are misjudged by the public; that "politics" has become a dirty word. A little reflection on their Detroit pronouncements will go a long way toward telling them why. The voting public may be cynical about the general motivations of politicians, but when they so openly place personal and partisan considerations above national needs, the public disgust over the performance is understandable.

The fact that both sides sought to protect their political flanks has over-serious overtones. When cooperation in Congress obviously is called for, the acrimony and bitterness that now exists will make it more difficult of achievement.

The best hope is that political leaders know quickly when they have stubbed their toes, and that they will hasten to find some constructive measures to eradicate the black eyes they have given themselves.

• EITHER OR—Some people have a tendency to relate Vietnam and the riots because they are the two most pressing matters facing government and because both require large expenditures of public funds.

A nameless veteran of Vietnam, among the soldiers sent into Detroit, was quoted as saying: "The war is here." This thinking is the basis for a new call that the Vietnam fighting, and the spending it requires, be cut down to provide greater funds for the war at home.

Two crises should not be related

The fact is that the United States possesses the material resources to finance both wars to the degree required. The war in Vietnam should not be affected by the anti-poverty needs at home, or vice versa.

There are two different crises that happen to be occurring at the same time. Both should, and can, be met at the same time.

Poor Given Priority

Lima, Peru — (NC) — Postponement of plans for the construction of a \$1.7 million shrine to St. Rose of Lima has been ordered by Juan Cardinal Landazuri Ricketts, O.F.M., of Lima in favor of the establishment of community have improved."

The project for the shrine to Lima's patron saint was initiated by former Mayoress Anita de Naranjo and became the subject of sharp criticism in the local press because of the estimated cost.

The cardinal, in a letter to the present mayor, Luis Bedoya, asked for an indefinite postponement of the shrine plans and a concentration of efforts instead on social assistance centers. The cardinal said he felt erection of such a shrine was "untimely" and that it should be deferred until "economic and social conditions among our community have improved."

'Cold War' Against Jews

New York — (RNS) — A group of influential Americans protested an "anti-Jewish assault" which it claims the government of the Soviet Union has launched against the 3,000,000 Jews in its territories because of frustration of Soviet policy in the Middle East.

In an open letter, released here and signed by Episcopal Bishop James A. Pike and Norman Thomas, noted Socialist author, the Conference on the Status of Soviet Jews declared that the Soviet government has launched a "cold war" on the Jews.

The authorities of the U.S.S.R. were urged in the letter to "initiate immediately a nationwide educational campaign against anti-Semitism," and to restore to Soviet Jewry the right, institutions and dignity to which Soviet laws entitles it.

According to the statement, the harassment of Jews, begun under Joseph Stalin but somewhat relaxed under Nikita Khrushchev, has been revived by an enormous propaganda campaign growing out of the Soviet break with Israel in the Middle East crisis.

Blue Army Pilgrimage

Plainfield, N.J. — (RNS) — An around-the-world peace pilgrimage to 20 nations, including Vietnam, has been scheduled by the Blue Army of Our Lady of Fatima.

Accompanying the Blue Army pilgrims will be Bishop Joao Pereira Verandio of Leiria, Portugal, in whose diocese is located the famous Marian shrine at Fatima.

Details of the worldwide tour were announced here at the close of a Blue Army national seminar. The pilgrimage will start at Fatima in Portugal on Oct. 11 and end in Columbus, Ohio, on Nov. 13.

More Aid Sent Arabs

Vatican City — (RNS) — Officials of International Caritas announced here that a large consignment of medicines and other relief goods left Rome for Cairo to be distributed among Arab civilian victims of the Middle East War.

The Roman Catholic relief agency noted that the supplies — like similar previous shipments — have been sent by the Holy Father through the Pontificia Assistenza Organization and the international Caritas to help the population of the United Arab Republic seriously affected by the recent conflict.

German Reds Toy with Luther

Berlin — (NC) — West German Protestant leaders who want to attend the 450th anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation in the East German town of Wittenberg, next October, will have to knuckle under to stiff political demands leveled by East Germany's communist government.

According to articles printed in the government newspaper Neue Zeit, and the Communist party's Neues Deutschland, West German churchmen planning to attend anniversary celebrations must first announce their opposition to the policies of the West German government. They must also publicly support West Germany's diplomatic recognition of East Germany, a step West Germany's Bonn government has so far refused to take.

(Wittenberg, site of the celebration that brought forth the East German demand, is the town where Martin Luther sparked the Protestant Reformation by tacking his 95 theses on the door of the castle church.)

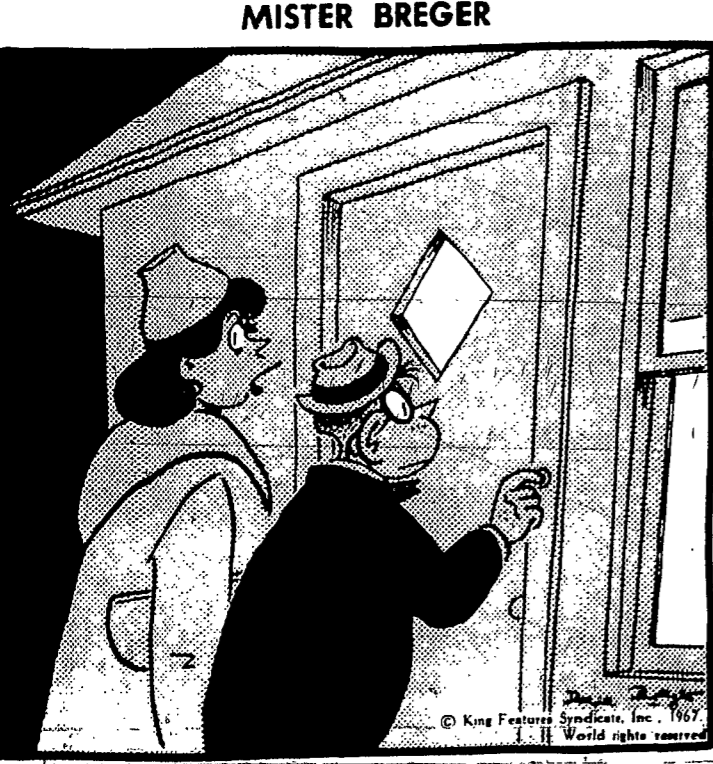
