



'All Seasons' Wins Award

Try to See Both Sides

Montserrat — (NC) — Joaquin Ruiz-Gimenez, who has been chosen to give the closing address at the World Congress of the Laity at Rome in October, has been described as a man of two traditions. He is a man who is committed to democratic change and yet at the same time is reluctant to break away completely from the past.

He is a true Spaniard, appreciating the depths of his own culture and respecting his fellow countrymen who cling to these traditions. However, he sees that Spain must move with the times and that now is a moment when the Spanish people must re-evaluate and build.

Ruiz-Gimenez exhibited his ability to move within these two traditions during a recent meeting of Pax Romana's European members in Montserrat outside of Barcelona, Spain.

Being president of the graduate and intellectual division of Pax Romana, international movement of Catholic students and intellectuals, he played an important role in setting the tone of this conference which was progressive, yet cognizant of the value of past traditions.

When faced with an attack on the religious expression of the Church in Spain and the government's failure to grant complete religious freedom to the Protestants, Ruiz-Gimenez answered with a skill developed from his long years of experience.

He pointed out that when he had been president of the student division of Pax Romana in 1940, and a group of young Spaniards burned some Protestant churches, Pax Romana intervened.

Today at least there are no more burnings, and furthermore a new religious liberty law has been introduced.

"Even though the legislation is not satisfactory, we have evolved," declared Ruiz-Gimenez, "but we will not rest until this law is in accord with the ideas of Vatican Council II."

Dr. Ruiz-Gimenez cautioned his friends to be just to those who were not capable of rising above history. "Those who attempt to understand the Marxist and the communist, must also try to understand the man of simple faith."

Joaquin Ruiz-Gimenez follows quite closely the thinking within the Church, especially the ideas and actions of Pope Paul VI, with whom he has developed a long and lasting friendship.

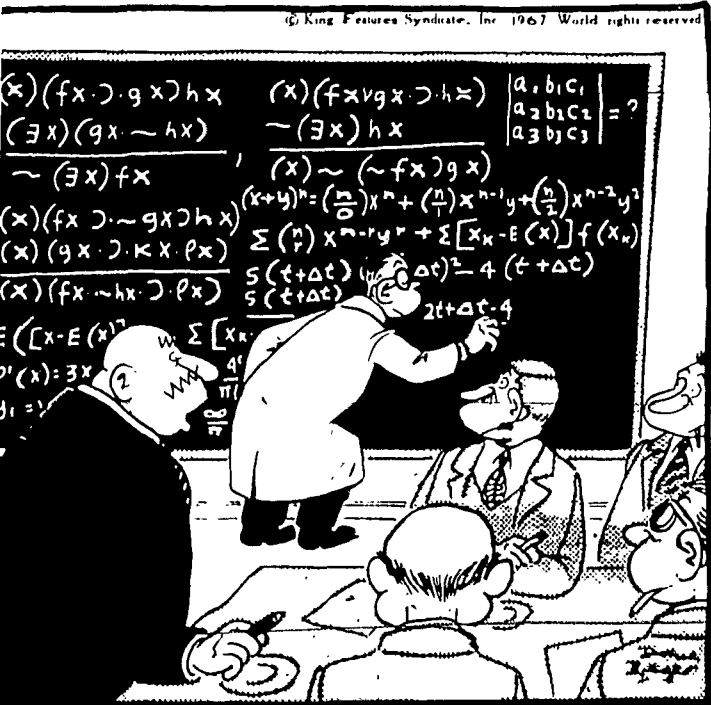
Ruiz-Gimenez came into contact with Pax Romana as a university student and at the congress at Fordham University in New York in 1939, he was elected president of its student division.

When World War II began, Ruiz-Gimenez found his way back to Spain via Italy. There in Italy, he came into contact with a young priest, Msgr. Giovanni Montini, who was then working with the Italian student groups in Rome. They collaborated on student projects while Ruiz-Gimenez remained president of Pax Romana throughout the war period. Then, in 1948, they again met when Ruiz-Gimenez returned to Rome as ambassador of Spain to the Holy See.

Ruiz-Gimenez began his studies in law and obtained his doctorate in law from Madrid in 1941. His interests lie in natural

law and he has published several books on this subject. In 1951 he joined General Franco's cabinet as minister of national education, and held this post until 1956. Now, at 54, he has chosen a more independent position. He publicly criticizes the government, and yet has not declared himself a member of the opposition. His road is sometimes lonely, but he feels this is the way to transmit his message to the Spanish people.

Kolping Group Builds School

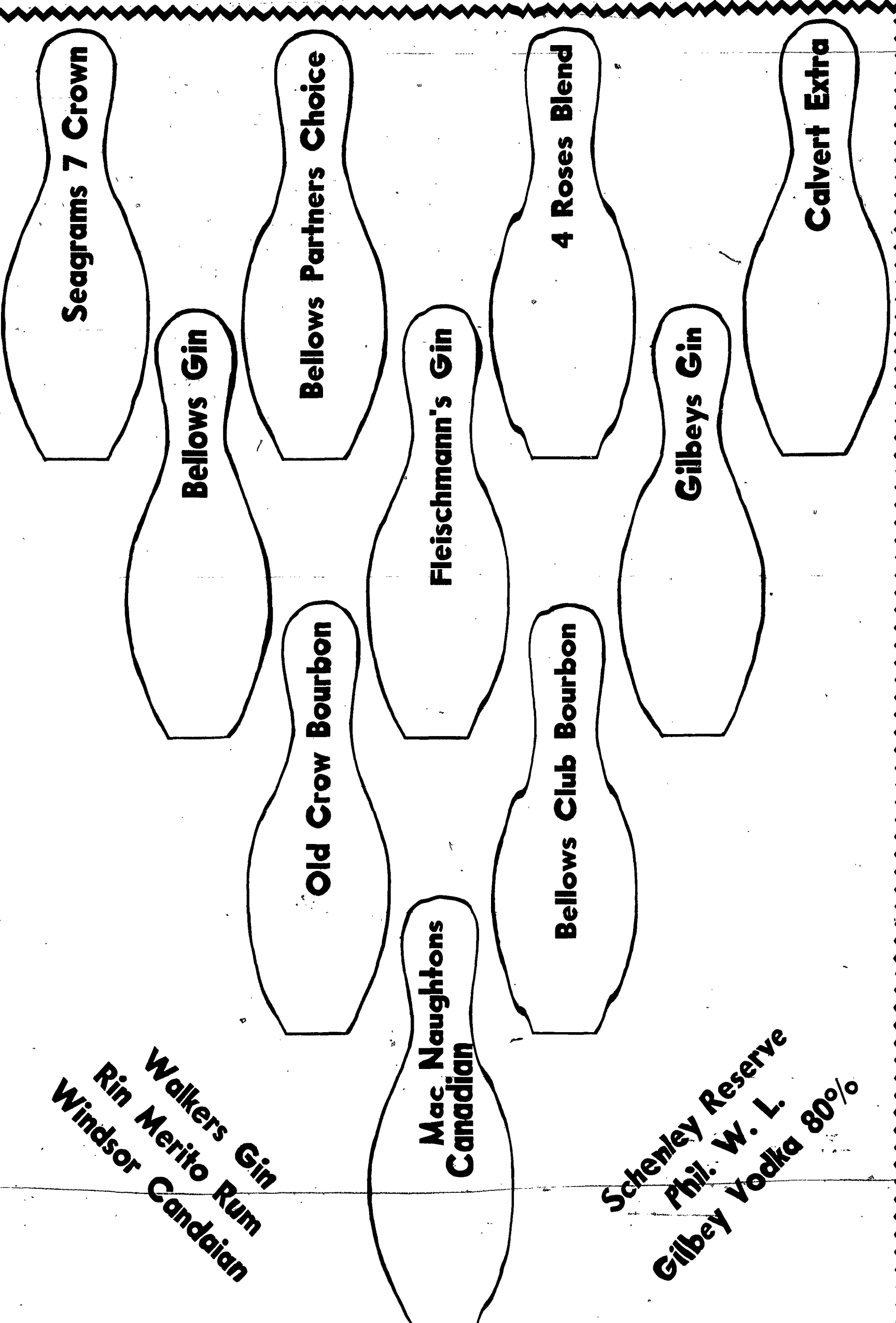
