

Downtown Day Camp Wins CYO Olympics

CYO Downtown Day Camp dethroned the defending champions CYO-St. Ambrose in last week's Junior Olympic Games held at Ellison Park to capture the 1967 title.

The daycampers from CYO Downtown accumulated 216 total points to outpace both St. Ambrose and St. Martin dePorres. The youngsters from St. Ambrose helped their camp to a second place with 195 points, while St. Martin dePorres, with 179 points, secured a third place in the day long olympiad.
