

Churchmen Repeat Open Housing Appeal

Washington (RNS)—Protestant, Catholic and Jewish representatives again appeared before a Congressional hearing here to urge that the Fair Housing Act of 1967 be made law.

Three churchmen testifying jointly before the Senate Subcommittee on Housing and Urban Affairs viewed the open housing measure as the beginning of a "much longer process that we hope will wipe out slums and remove the barriers that lead to housing ghettos."

The religious spokesmen had particular praise for a provision which would encourage real estate agencies, through education programs and gradual elimination of what were termed "covert" practices, to comply with the law without making them the scapegoats of wrath by their compliance.

"This nation can no longer afford to allow its efforts to provide the best education possible to all its people to be thwarted by actions of private persons — actions which are at least anti-social and immoral — and ultimately amount to a covert contravention of our public policy, which calls for equal educational opportunity," the advocates said.

Funds for Sick Cities

Washington (RNS)—Nearly 1,000 prominent religious, political, civil rights, education, and labor leaders, calling themselves the Urban Coalition, vowed to rally support for increased federal funds for programs which would get to the roots of the ills facing American cities.

This action came after a session with numerous Congressmen which was later described by some observers as a "cool" reception to the Coalition's plea that the government initiate a program which would provide jobs for at least a million unemployed persons in the inner city areas.

Numerous mayors of cities, recently beset with race riots, joined in the plea, along with Presiding Bishop John E. Hines of the Episcopal Church, for a

"re-defining" of poverty and for effective means of administering it, both on the governmental scale and in private efforts.

Bishop Hines was the official spokesman for the religious representatives at the one-day convocation called by the Urban Coalition. At least one-fourth of those at the convocation were prominent Protestant, Catholic or Jewish clergymen or laymen active in church circles.

Detroit Mayor Jerome P. Cavanagh, who was one of about

20 leaders who lunched with Speaker of the House John W. McCormack (D-Mass.) and other Congressmen, complained that the coalition leaders could ascertain "no sense of urgency" among the legislators.

Besides the proposal for providing a million jobs, the Coalition asked that there be immediate housing units for low-income families.

The Coalition also called for additional civil rights measures to help eliminate some of the causes of tension.
