St. Joseph Nuns' Head At Superiors' Seminar

Mother Agnes Cecilia, Mother General of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester, is now attending the first of three two-week sessions of a seminar on the Management of the Religious Community being held at St. Louis University. This seminar is designed for major religious superiors of women's institutes; its primary purpose is to provide the participants with a deeper understanding of the general principles of management and their adaptation to the effective operation of the religious community. There will be five hours a day of formal sessions and discussions, plus individual study. The instructors will be leaders in religious and lay life in the fields of management, sociology, canon law, psychiatry and psychology. Among the speakers in this first two weeks will be Rev. Thomas E. Clarke, S.J., Professor of Theology at Woodstock College, Maryland; Dr. Edward G. Gilbert, Staff Psychiatrist, St. John's Hospital, Santa Monica, Calif.; Rev. Eugene Kennedy, M.M., Professor of Psychology, Maryknoll Seminary, Illinois; Dr. Robert Lefton, Ph.D. Director of Management Services of the Psychological Associates, St. Louis, and experts in various fields from the Administrative Services Division of Arthur Anderson & Co., an internationally known firm of public accountants. The number of participants in this seminar was limited to 35, all of whom are major superiors of religious communities of women in the United States. This session extends from Sept. 3-15. Mother Agnes Cecilia will also be attending the later two sessions from Jan. 8-19, and April 29-May 10.

Liturgy Meet Lists Noted Priest-Author

A nationally known priest-author will be a keynote speaker for a Liturgy Institute scheduled for Rochester on Oct. 13-14.

Father Alfred A. McBride, a Norbertine priest currently teaching at Catholic University in Washington, will open the

Rochester session of "Worship 67," with a talk on "Liturgy: Its meaning in Our Lives."

A similar institute will be held in Auburn on Oct. 6-7 and another in Elmira on Oct. 20-21. Each will begin with a Friday evening session, continue with a Saturday morning program ending in a community Mass.

Father McBride, 38, is the author of "Catechetics: Theology of Proclamation," and Homilies for the New Liturgy." He has contributed frequently to Catholic magazines on topics connected with liturgy and preaching.

He also authors a syndicated column running in 10 papers and entitled "Bible Themes for Modern Man."

The three institutes, which will have identical programs but for the most part, different speakers, have been arranged by the Liturgical Commission of the Diocese of Rochester. Application blanks are available now in parish rectories for pre-registration.
