Returning Veterans Boost Cardinal Mooney's Hopes

Cardinal Mooney High School, in its 4th year of varsity football competition, will enter coming season with a veteran crew. The Greece Catholic School compiled a 5 won and 3 lost mark last year.

The Cardinals, coached by capable Anthony Merola for the past 3 years, face a tough 8 game schedule, with two new opponents on its schedule in Elmira Southside and Catholic Central of Troy, N.Y.

Mooney opens the new season on Saturday, September 16 against Elmira at McQuaid field.

The Cardinals will miss the services of two outstanding boys, All-Catholic Quarter back Jim Harrington and pile driving fullback Dick Musciow who have graduated. A number of

fine backfield prospects loom as replacements, however. Juniors Terry Meagher and John Waffle, along with Soph Pete Van Allen are vying for the job. The other backfield spots will be filled by Dick Parker, Ron Klem, Frank Latempio, Terry Freeman, Dick Stonegraber and Tim Shopiker.

The line looks strong with Seniors, Mike Urbanas at 230, John Corcoran at 210, 220 lbs. Ron Durbin, Cocaptain Randy Garrett at 190, 185 lbs. Paul Hank, Dick Hart, Mike Smith, Mike Bunting and Jim Winterroth all being contenders.

The 45 man squad has been going through its paces with great spirit and hopes for a successful season loom high at Mooney.

Aquinas Preps For Grid Opener

For the first time in 19 years Aquinas finds itself with only seven games scheduled for the football season. Not since 1948, when Erie Prep cancelled a game with Harry Wright's powerhouse has Aquinas opened the season while still looking for an eighth opponent.

Catholic High of Altoona, Pa. was verbally committed as the Little Irish's eighth foe, but decided against the contest at the last minute.

Since then Aquinas authorities have been searching for a replacement.

If no opposition is found be-

fore the season's end, a "challenge game" between Aquinas and the city or county champion might be arranged.

The Aquinas season begins on Sept. 16 with a game against Mt. Pleasant of Schenectady. The Irish will also take on a pair of Erie, Pa. schools, Erie East and Erie Prep. Contests with the three Rochester Catholic high schools round out the slate.

The 1967 season will be the third for Aquinas head coach, Bob Rosmarino. The former Holy Cross football star guided his well-conditioned troops to identical 6-2 records in 1965 and 1966.

Last year the Rosemarino-coached Aquinas team won the Catholic League championship with decisive wins over McQuaid, Mooney, and Kearney.

Twelve lettermen return from last year's squad. However, the L'Irish lost a number of starters through graduation, including High School All-American Don Hall.

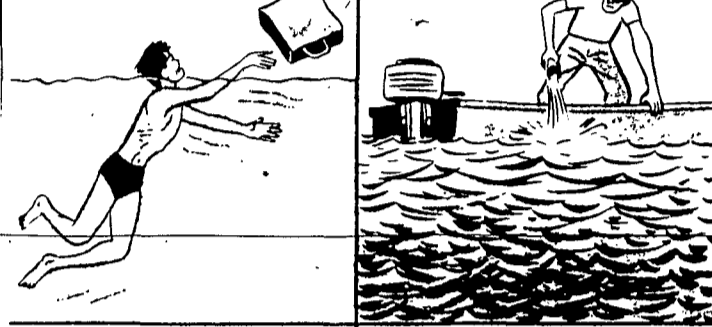
Skeet Shooting Olympic Tryouts

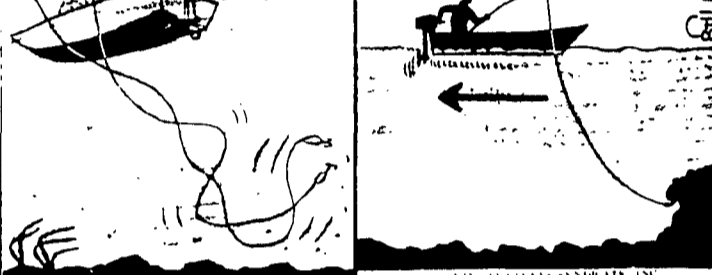

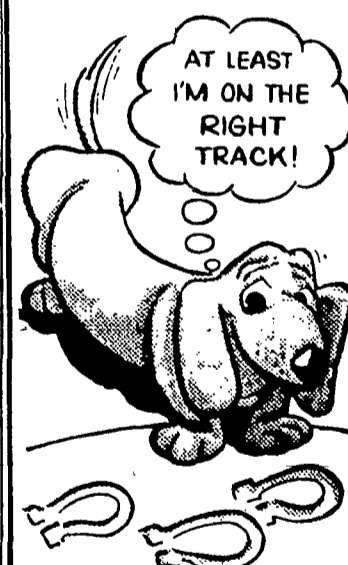
Rochesterian Holy Cross Dean

Still in Harness

Batavia — Lou Drayton, 76 the nation's oldest active harness race driver, is unique. He doesn't yearn for the good old days.

The spry oldtimer has two horses at Batavia. He's refused offers of \$20,000 for each of the pacers.

"Harness racing is much better nowadays. There are more tracks, bigger purses and improved racing conditions."

Drayton should know. He has been training and driving horses in both the United States and Canada for sixty-four years. He succeeded his father (who raced horses until he was 85) into the sport.

"Actually, I got my start with trotters at my father's livery stable in Bemus Point, near Jamestown," Drayton recalled. "There's only one active driver near my age. He's Joe Hylan, a year younger," he added.

Drayton's favorite is Sweetheart Volto, "a real family horse. I raised her, raised her mother and her grandmother. Sweetheart took a record of 2:06 3/5 at Rockingham," he noted proudly.

Drayton also refused \$20,000 for Quick Card. "I bought this pacer for \$1,150 at an auction in Delaware. So far, he's earned nearly \$30,000."

Lou Drayton gave up the carpentry trade when he was 30 years old "because they only paid 25c an hour."

"I used to help my father. In fact, when I was thirteen I was driving at county fairs whenever my father couldn't make it."
