

K of C Sponsors Scholarships

State Deputy James E. Foey has announced the start of the scholarship program for the 1967 Columbian Year, sponsored by the New York Council's Knights of Columbus.

Scholarships are open to any Catholic graduate of a recognized high school in New York State during the term ending January or June 1968. Candidates are required to submit to a preliminary regular college entrance test in scholastic aptitude given by the College Entrance Board of Princeton, N.J., on Saturday, December 2, 1967.

Scholarships may be used at any Catholic college in the U.S., and subject to approval by the committee. Applications must be filed with the committee no later than October 28, 1967 and may be obtained from local high schools, Grand Knights of local council or by writing to the chairman.

Funeral Held For Fr. Baier Franciscan

Franciscan Father David Baier, former St. Bonaventure University faculty member died in Holy Name College, Washington, D.C., Monday, August 28. Requiem Mass was offered Thursday morning in the chapel of St. Bonaventure Friary. Principal celebrant of a con-celebrated Mass was Very Rev. Francis J. Muller, O.F.M., Definitor General of the Franciscan Order in Rome, assisted by Very Rev. Finian Kerwin, O.F.M., provincial of the Holy Name Province and Very Rev. Theodore Cavanaugh, O.F.M., superior of Holy Name College, Washington, D.C. Absolution and Blessing at the burial was by Auxiliary Bishop Stanley Brzana, of Buffalo.

Father David studied at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, Rochester, and after joining the Franciscan Order was ordained Dec. 20, 1913. He earned his master's degree from Catholic University in 1915, and was awarded his doctorate in dogmatic theology from the University of Munster, Germany, in 1925. For several years he taught at Franciscan houses of theology throughout the Holy Name Province. In 1946 he was named guardian and rector of Holy Name College, Washington, D.C. He was a Franciscan priest for more than 50 years.

Burial was in St. Bonaventure Cemetery, Allegany, N.Y. Surviving are his brother, Aloysius M. Baier, Rochester, and several nieces and nephews.

Finger Lakes Track Breaks Labor Day Mark

Canandaigua — The record-shattering total of \$682,945 in pari-mutuel sales at Finger Lakes Race Track on Labor Day (Sept. 4) topped by \$25,657 the previous high set Labor Day 1964. This performance followed close upon the heels of significant gains of 7.4% in attendance and 10% in handle registered for the combined spring and summer meetings over last year's figures for corresponding periods.

The 53-day summer meet reflected the largest gains percentage-wise of any thoroughbred track in the nation running concurrently with the local oval.

With the 39-day Autumn session of the track's continuous 125-day racing season now underway officials anticipate, that when the curtain rings down Monday, October 16, the track will have experienced the most successful season in its history.

Highlight of the entire season will be the fifth running of the \$10,000 added New York Breeders Futurity, Saturday, Sept. 16. Of the record-breaking total of 121 nominations, 82 have been kept eligible for this 6-furlong classic.

Traditionalists Want Latin Mass Restored

New York — (RNS) — Father Kurz, exiled prefect apostolic of Yungchow, China, as principal ordinary of the Traditionalist Latin Rite in the U.S.A. and to consecrate new bishops from among the 156 U.S. priests whom Father De Pauw claims have joined the CTM.

In a 12-page letter he sent to the pontiff on Aug. 15, Father De Pauw described the present state of the Catholic Church as one of such chaos and utter collapse that "only a Pope who is willing to exercise his God-given prerogatives can save the Church now from total disintegration."

The letter, which was made public on Aug. 28, asked the Pope to establish a "vernacular rite" for those interested in it, "and publicly revitalize our now dormant centuries-old Latin Rite by eliminating from it the prelates and priests who planned its destruction."

Father Fullerton; Taught at Aquinas

Funeral services for Father Vincent J. Fullerton, C.S.B., a pioneer Basilian teacher at Aquinas Institute, were held on Sept. 7 at St. Basil's Church in Toronto, following services the previous day in Windsor.

Father Fullerton, died last Monday after a brief illness.

Pontifical High Mass of Requiem was celebrated Wednesday in Assumption Church, Windsor, Ont., by Bishop Charles Nelligan of the Assumption faculty. Father Fullerton was on the staff of Assumption High School, Windsor, at the time of his death.

A native of Toronto, Father Fullerton entered the Basilian Community in 1927 and was ordained to the priesthood at Toronto in 1935. For a number of years he was procurator for Basilian Mexican Missions and spoke throughout the United States in mission appeals.

At Aquinas Father Fullerton taught Spanish, a language he spoke like a native. He was often in demand by the Spanish speaking community in Rochester as a speaker and confessor.

Surviving Father Fullerton are four others: Joseph James, William and the Very Reverend John Fullerton, S.M., and one sister: Sister St. Vincent of the Sisters of St. Joseph.
