

Sister in Meditation Room!



Notre Dame --- RNS) -- Dele gates at a symposium here asked the National Conference o Catholic Bishops to present the question of clerical celibacy to the international Synod o Bishops which will convene in Rome Sept. 29.

The symposium was held at Notre Dame University's Center for Continuing Education under the sponsorship of the National Association for Pastoral Renew al. Its resolutions, addressed specifically to the bishops' conference, related the question of celibacy to "a clergy now declining in numbers" and to "recognition of the dignity and freedom of the individual priest.'


