Gets New Post**

Father Frederick Black, librarian at St. John Fisher College from 1960 until July of this year, has been transferred to the Basilian Fathers' curial house in Toronto, where he will serve as a special assistant to Father Joseph C. Wey, superior general of the congregation.

Father Black will be responsible for editorial supervision of the "Basic Document," the new Basilian rule and constitution authorized by the Basilian General Chapter held at St. John Fisher recently.

A Toronto native, Father Black served as a librarian and faculty member at St. Michael's College there, before his assignment to St. John Fisher. He attended the University of Toronto, the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies, Oxford University, and the University of Chicago. In Rochester he was a popular speaker and book reviewer.

**Hebrew Schools
Record Gains**

New York—(RNS)—Hebrew Day Schools in New York City and neighboring Nassau and Westchester counties have an enrollment of 48,000 students for 1967-68.

Dr. Joseph Kaminsky, national director of Torah Umesorah, National Society for Hebrew Day Schools, said the figure represents a 3 per cent increase over the previous year.

According to Dr. Kaminsky, five new schools were established in the metropolitan area during the Summer, bringing the total to 159.

Hebrew Day Schools offer a combined program of religious and secular studies. There are 105 elementary schools and 54 secondary units.

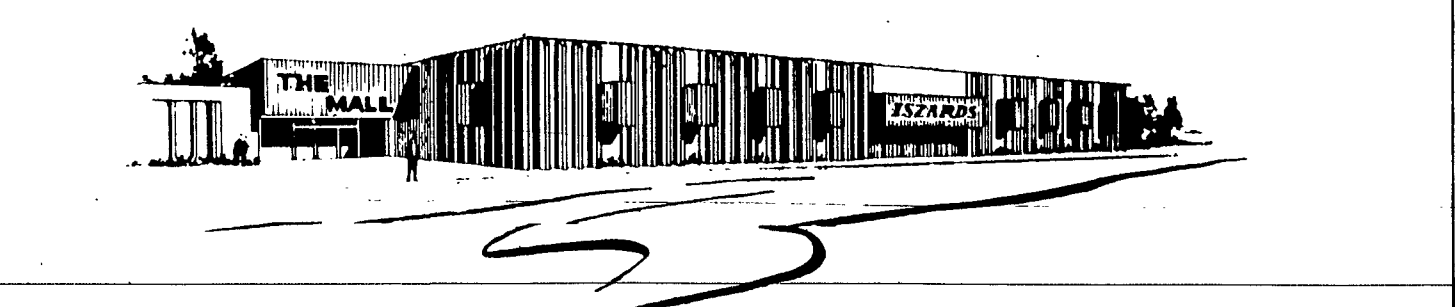
