**DCCW Board Meets to Chart Future**

The future direction of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women (DCCW) will be decided this Sunday, Sept. 17 when the Board of Directors meet in Victor. The meeting is set for 2:30 p.m. at St. Patrick's School of Religion on High St.

The interim president of the DCCW, Mrs. Robert Waterman, will preside.

Two separate studies have been underway in the past three months in an effort to chart a course for the women's federation, which embraces some

60,000 members in Catholic organizations through the diocese.

One research group, under the direction of Mrs. Ronald Gledhill, favors retention of the present Council structure, with some needed revamping.

Another research group, headed by Mrs. J. Raymond Hensler, is recommending a complete change in structure and operation.

Both approaches will be explained at the Victor meeting.

The voting of the Board members will decide the outcome—whether the DCCW remains part of the National Council of Catholic Women or whether an entirely new organization, locally oriented, is needed.
