

Vista Reps Here To Seek Volunteers Oct. 2-6

VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America), the rapidly growing national corps of anti-poverty workers, has 4,000 Volunteers in service or being trained, but has requests for up to 10,000 people.

Representatives of VISTA will be in the Rochester area during Oct. 2-6 to seek qualified candidates willing to spend a year of their lives in the service to their country.

VISTA recruits, selects and trains volunteers and then assigns them to projects throughout the country which have asked for help. They may serve in urban slums, in rural areas, at Job Corps Centers, on Indian reservations, in migrant labor communities, and in programs for the mentally handicapped.

Local headquarters for the drive will be the Council of Social Agencies of Rochester and Monroe Counties, Inc. at 70 N. Water Street in Rochester. VISTA representatives will be there from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on October 3, 4 and 5. They can be reached there by phone at 454-2770. Recruiters will also be visiting the campuses of Nazareth College, Monroe Community College, the Rochester Institute of Technology, the University of Rochester, S.U.N.Y. College at Geneseo and S.U.N.Y. College at Brockport, during the Oct. 2-6 period.

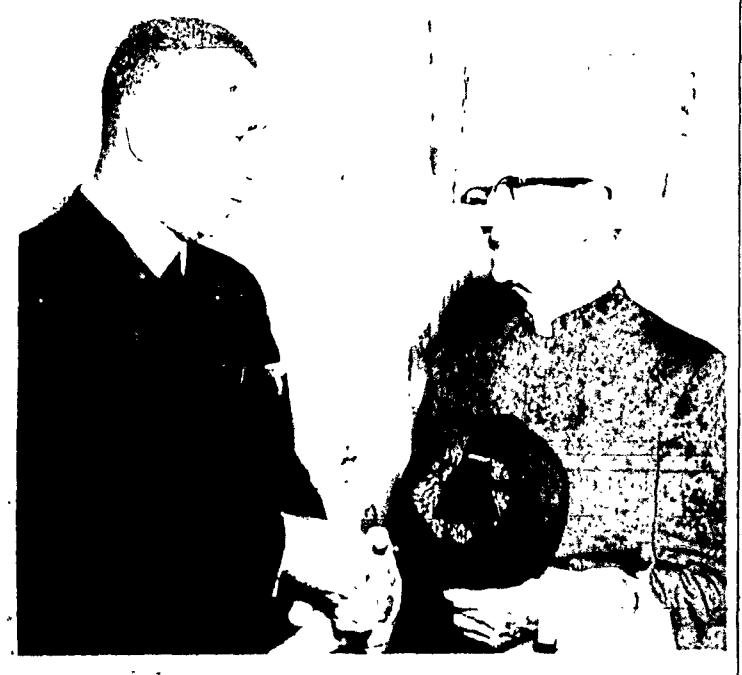
Brother Carpenter credits Monsignor Eckl for guiding him to the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart when he was seeking a religious order 25 years ago.

Brother Carpenter, the first Negro to become a Sacred Heart Brother in this country, considers himself a pioneer in the integration apostolate long before it was front page news. He told the Courier this week he has felt "no distinction" in his quarter of a century in the order but has been appointed to his various duties "on the basis of my abilities and not because of any racial bias."

He is currently coordinator

of the Laymen's Retreat League in Youngstown, Ohio. He will celebrate his anniversary privately with friends in Rochester.

Monsignor Eckl will be honored this Sunday by priests who have served as assistant pastors to him at St. Andrew's.

By Wednesday noon of this week 575 people in the Diocese of Rochester had contributed \$2,865 to the Latin American Mission Fund, according to an announcement from Monsignor John F. Duffy of the Diocesan Mission Office.

"We are very gratified with the results so far," the Diocesan Director commented, "and this amount represents the mail receipts for only six days." Monsignor Duffy continued with the observation, "Actually, in response to appeals of this nature, the returns are spread out over a three or four week period of time."
