



> 'POP' BANANA NUT BREAD (1 loaf)

- 1¼ cups flour, sifted
- tsp. salt
- tsp. baking soda
- tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 2 ripe bananas
- 1/4 cup buttermilk
- 1/4 cup Blue Bonnet Margarine
- cup sugar 1 egg
- Sift flour, salt, soda and baking powder together; stir in nuts. Mash bananas, and blend with buttermilk (or put bananas and buttermilk in blender on low speed for a few seconds).
