big crayon. The concluding part of this work finds Susan writing large script letters or large script words, depending on the current level of ability.

This day long program that takes up 12 hours of every day finds Susan in her usual good spirits, despite natural fatigue, she displays a ready wit, but willing to call it a day — only to go through the same exacting schedule in another 12 hours.

In the short space of time these treatments have been given, a marked improvement has been noted in her ability to creep, crawl and raise herself erect on her knees. Her right hand closed in a fist at the start is responding nicely and is now partially open. Then too, her speech is showing signs of returning and her balance has also improved.

Mrs. Aiello is hopeful that Susan will continue to respond to the efforts of the willing volunteers and expressed her deep gratitude to the many who have aided in this continuing program.

**Therapy — and Prayer**

The devoted mother of Susan attributes much of the progress to the prayers of hundreds of Susan's friends and to the many Masses and Rosaries being offered for her recovery. Mrs. Aiello doesn't hesitate to say that Susan's response to date is truly miraculous.

The Aiello family are members of St. Mary's parish. Susan graduated from Notre Dame high school in 1964 and was a second year student in Corning Community College at the time of the accident.

It is estimated that 86% of such cases meet with success while the remaining 14% show no response.

After seeing Susan through the 45 minute tedious and concentrated efforts to overcome her paralysis, it must be noted that her great determination, courage and a good sense of humor will achieve the maximum results that are possible.

**Sgt. J. P. Neary, Policeman, Dies**

Monsignor Robert A. Keleher offered the Funeral Mass for Police Sgt. James P. Neary in St. Charles Borromeo Church, Tuesday, Sept. 19.

Sgt. Neary, 54, of 25 South Hampton Dr., member of the Police Bureau for 26 years, died Sept. 16, 1967. The esteem in which he was held by his fellow officers was demonstrated by a large motorcycle escort at the funeral.

Born in Rochester, he attended St. Monica School. He was graduated in 1933 from Aquinas Institute where he starred as a basketball forward and football center.

He joined the Police Bureau Jan. 16, 1941 and was promoted to sergeant March 11, 1960. He was assigned to traffic enforcement division for most of his career. Last year he was transferred to traffic records section.

He was a familiar figure to thousands in Rochester from heading the St. Patrick's Day parade.

Sgt. Neary was a member of the Police Bureau Holy Name Society, Locust Club, Rosewood Club and Police Benevolent Association.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Helen L. Neary, two sons and one daughter, Frederic J. Neary, Mrs. Michael (Barbara) Copierscho, and Robert Neary; three grandchildren, one brother, Andrew T. Neary, one sister, Mrs. James (Mildred) Brann.
