





The constitution, one of three "working papers" on which the symposium's discussions will be based, will be presented by Father Ladislaus Orsy, S.J., a professor of Canon Law at Ford-ham's School of Theology.

Other working papers will be prepared by Father Edward L. Heston, C.S.C., procurator of the Congregation of the Holy Cross, and Father Andrew M Greeley, a sociologist with the National Opinion Research Center at the University of Chi-

Father Heston will describe the present organizational structure of the Church and its legal processes beyond the diocesan level. Father Greeley will present a critique of the present structure, describing its weaknesses and failures.
