

## New Faculty Named At John Fisher College

The appointment of six new full-time faculty members at St. John Fisher College has been announced by Rev. Joseph B. Dorsey, C.S.B., vice-president for academic affairs.

They include Dr. Robert G. Kieffer, assistant professor of chemistry who before coming to St. John Fisher, was employed as a research chemist by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, Washington, D.C.

Kieffer earned his Ph.D. in inorganic chemistry at the University of America.

Dr. Paul Mitacek, Jr., assistant professor of chemistry is a graduate of Oberlin College and Pennsylvania State University, which awarded him the Ph.D. in physical chemistry in 1962. Dr. Mitacek was a resident research assistant at Argonne National Laboratory from 1963 until this summer.

Dr. John M. Lembo, assistant professor of psychology is new chairman of the Fisher Psychology Department. Dr. Lembo previously taught at St. Bonaventure University and St. John College, Cleveland, Ohio. He received his B.A. in philosophy from La Salle College, Philadelphia, Pa., his M.A. in guidance and counseling from Xavier University, Cincinnati, Ohio, and his Ed.D. in educational psychology from Western Reserve University, Cleveland.

Noeli B. Shuell, assistant professor of theology is a doctoral candidate in theology at Marquette University. Mr. Shuell received his M.Ed. and B.A. degrees from St. Mary's College, Winona, Minn. He is a member of the American Academy of Religion, American Catholic Philosophical Association, Liturgical Conference, Society of Biblical Literature and Exegesis, and the Society of Catholic College Teachers of Sacred Doctrine.

Mr. Roman Tratch, assistant professor of psychology is a native of the Ukraine. Mr. Tratch received the licentiate in psychology at the University of Louvain, Belgium, the B.S.W. in social work from the University of Toronto, and is a doctoral candidate in psychology at

## Fordham Philosopher To Open Fisher Series

Father Norris Clarke, S.J., professor of philosophy at Fordham University and editor of *International Philosophical Quarterly*, will discuss "Cybernetics and the Uniqueness of Man" at St. John Fisher College Wednesday, October 4, at 7:45 p.m. in Kearney Auditorium.

The program, the first in the 1967-68 series being co-sponsored by the Fisher Philosophy Department and Philosophy Club, is open to the public. There is no admission charge. An open discussion period will follow the lecture.

In his lecture Father Clarke will explore and analyze human and artificial intelligence

vis-a-vis the freedom of the individual. The Jesuit scholar is co-author of the recently published *Christian Wisdom and Christian Formation*. He is a frequent contributor to philosophical journals and an editor of *New Scholasticism*.

Other noted speakers who will appear in the lecture series at St. John Fisher this year include Dr. Germain Grisez of Georgetown University, author of *Contraception and the Natural Law*; Dr. Colin Turbayne, professor of philosophy at the University of Rochester and author of *Myth and Metaphor*; and Dr. L. James Ross, professor of the philosophy of religion at the University of Pennsylvania.
