

Auburn Opens Liturgy Meets

Auburn — Approximately 150 lay leaders, parish priests and sisters attended the first of three diocesan liturgy institutes held here last weekend.

Similar two-day sessions under the title of "Worship '67," are scheduled for this weekend (Oct. 13-14) in Rochester, St. Thomas More parish and next weekend (Oct. 20-21) at Elmira's Notre Dame High School.

Father Joseph Champlin of Syracuse keyed the Auburn institute with a discussion of current changes in the liturgy. Stressing the need for such changes, he said, "we must try them, and if they don't work

well, we can continue to experiment further."

He predicted wider use of Home Masses in the future (the Rochester Diocese is already moving ahead in this). He suggested that in the sacrament of Penance, a bright, relaxing atmosphere would be more appropriate than a dark, closed confessional.

The two day program included several elective sessions on Saturday morning and ended with a community Mass at St. Mary's Church at noon. Monsignor James E. Cuffney, St. Mary's pastor, celebrated the Mass entirely in English, illustrating the language change in the Canon coming up on Oct. 22.

Monsignor William Shannon of Nazareth College spoke at the general session on Saturday morning. The elective sessions followed. A Presbyterian minister, Dr. Conrad Massa of Rochester, spoke at the section on "The Homily and the Word of God." He is also professor of homiletics at St. Bernard's Seminary. Mrs. Gerard Lesch, former president of the Auburn Board of Education, was one of the lay leaders.

Tonight's liturgy institute at St. Thomas More parish starts at 7:30 p.m. with the doors being open from 6:30 p.m. on for late registrants.

Tennis Court Bubbles Over During Winter

The well known plastic "Bubble" is again in place at the Tennis Club of Rochester on Farrington Place for the season October 15-May 15th. The "Bubble" was installed Friday, Oct. 6.

The "Bubble" is held up by air pressure alone. There is no framework and every inch of enclosed space is useable. More like balloons than buildings, these structures are inflated and held erect by a remarkably slight air pressure pumped in by a small blower. Aisheltons are made of high strength coated fabric woven of the same tough nylon cord used in making premium tires, covered with weather resistant vinyl. This coated nylon is air, water and fireproof.

The plastic "Bubble," which covers clay courts one and two, is open to the public on a reservation basis on a single day or seasonal basis. The "Bubble" will be open daily, 7 days a week from 7:30 a.m. to 12 midnight. The temperature of the "Bubble" will be kept at approximately 50 degrees.

According to Roy Hock, Manager there are still a few open times left open — in the morning from 7:30 to noon and also from 10:30 to midnight.
