America's highest paid and most admired advertising woman, Bernice Fitz-Gibbon, will be in Rochester, Nov. 8 to speak at a fundraising luncheon sponsored by the Women's Council of Rochester Institute of Technology.

Proceeds from the luncheon, scheduled for 12:15 p.m. at the Chamber of Commerce, will go toward an interfaith chapel on RIT's new campus.



Nicknamed the "Fabulous Fitz," Bernice Fitz-Gibbon is known for her witty, wise, and provocative "Fitz-isms" on everything from advertising to education. Many of these obser-

ventions are found in her recently published autobiography, "Macy's, Gimbels and Me," which is written to the theme, "If I can do it anybody, but anybody, can do it."

Originally a Wisconsin farm girl, Miss Fitz-Gibbon began as a newspaper reporter on the Rockford (Ill.) Morning Star. Moving to Chicago, she received her first training and experience in the retail field at Marshall Field's.

From Field's, she moved to New York and Macy's, where she created "It's smart to be thrifty," still in use today. Her next stop was advertising director of Wanamaker's; then she moved on to Gimbels where she achieved advertising fame with the motto, "Nobody but nobody undersells Gimbels," also still in use. She now heads her own advertising business.

# Nuns Council in Paterson

Clifton, N.J. — (NC) — Bishop Lawrence B. Casey of Paterson, N.J., told a group of nuns here "the fundamental principles of religious life are so deeply and firmly embedded within the structure of the Church that they will remain alive and strong."

Referring to those who "proclaim that religious life is on the wane and will eventually be phased out," Bishop Casey assured the Sisters "the Holy Spirit will not permit a way of life which has flourished since the early days of the Church—and which constitutes one of the brightest pages of her history—to die."

Bishop Casey preached at a Mass at Pope Paul VI High School here to inaugurate the Paterson Diocesan Council of Sisters. Members of the 27 religious communities of women represented in the diocese attended the Mass.

"THE WHOLE body of faithful Christians is much more impressed by your dedicated example," Bishop Casey told the Sisters, "than they are by people who downgrade you needlessly. The authors of articles which deride religious life neglect to mention the glorious achievements of religious orders in past centuries, and they gloss over or minimize your present contributions and your ability to renew and adapt."

"Our Catholic schools, the backbone of the Church in the United States, could not exist without you," the bishop continued. "Without the Sisters, our Catholic hospitals and institutions would largely disappear. And you know the other professional fields to which you make a distinct contribution."
