Kearney Sinks Carthage 19-7

The Bishop Kearney gridlers romped to their first win of the season, 19 to 7 over Carthage High last Saturday afternoon at Carthage.

With 16 seconds remaining in the first half Bishop Kearney's Rick Curro broke off left end for 30 yards and a first and goal on the Carthage 5. The King's quarterback threaded the needle as he threw between three defenders to hit Chris Haefner for Bishop Kearney's first touchdown. Mike Knope was shy of the point after as he tried to run the ball up the middle.

Knope led the Kings on 11 plays and four first downs before Rick Curro fought his way over from the two to give Kearney a 12-0 lead. Kearney's insurance touchdown came when reserve quarterback Jim McGrath threw to Denny Fitzpatrick on a play that covered 15 yards.

The Carthage Cornets scored their first and only touchdown with three minutes and forty seconds left in the game on a 5-yard sweep by quarterback Roger Hansek. He then booted the point after.

This was the second loss for Carthage and the first for Kearney. The teams having played five games. The Kearney defense led by co-captain Kevin Archibald was outstanding in holding the Cornets to a total of 65 yards.

Rick Curro led both teams in rushing with a 180 of B.K.'s 290 total yards. The Kearney eleven will meet Notre Dame of Elmira at Aquinas Stadium at 2:00 p.m. next Sunday afternoon (Oct. 22).

Cardinal Mooney Defense Bogs Down McQuaid, 20-6

By TIM BERGIN Cardinal Mooney continued its grid mastery over McQuaid last Sunday at Aquinas Stadium by a 20-6 score, the third straight year the Cards have prevailed.

In gaining the victory, their first against 3 losses, Mooney relied heavily on a rugged defense and the elusive running of halfback Charlie Lowry. The win enabled the Cards to replace the Knights in second place in the Catholic League standings with a 1-1 record, ahead of McQuaid's 1-2. Overall, the Knights are 1-4.

Neither team was able to sustain a drive in the first quarter, but with 2 minutes remaining, Lowry grabbed a pitchout and sped 46 yards around right end for a touchdown. Paul Nealon booted the first of his 2 extra points, and the Mooney defense made the 7-0 lead stand through the first half.

In the third quarter, the Knights' quarterback Nick Combs brought his team to life by galloping 76 yards for a score on an electrifying "transcontinental" pass play. The pass came from halfback Bob Carr, who had started a sweep to the right before whirling and firing to Combs racing up the op-

posite side of the field. Mooney's defense again came up with the big play, though, by stopping Bill Cutler's extra point plunge attempt and retaining a 7-6 lead.

Early in the final period, Mooney took over on its own 43 and marched steadily upfield until Lowry, on a fourth and four play, wove 29 yards for his second score. Then, in the final 3 minutes of play, the Cards' Bob Merkel recovered a McQuaid fumble on the Knights' 3 and two calls later, fullback Dick Parker bulled in from the 8 to complete the scoring.

Lowry had a good day in every department, leading the rushers with 114 yards, proving a dangerous pass receiver, and shining at his defensive safety. For McQuaid, defenders Cutler and Bob Comparato were standouts.

This Saturday, Cardinal Mooney will host Notre Dame of Batavia while McQuaid travels to Watertown to meet the potent Cyclones.

Action at other levels last week saw McQuaid's J.V. team chalk up its fourth in a row with a 20-0 victory over Bishop Kearney and the Knights' fresh drop a 21-19 decision to Madison.
