

Aquinas Rolling In High Gear

The Little Irish of Aquinas Institute, showing their best style of the season, made it three in a row last Saturday crushing East High of Erie, Pa. 41-20, at Aquinas Memorial Stadium.

But the sobering thought of what is in store during the remainder of the season sent them back into intensive drills without a letup.

Coach Bob Rosmarino's crew did a superb job outclassing a fighting and highly touted Erie eleven. But the holiday is just about over. Aquinas drew a bye this weekend but then it's Auburn High and after that Erie Prep. A meeting with Bishop Kearney will close out the season.

Aquinas showed its loyal fans some razzle-dazzle football as the Maroon and White romped over Erie. East was rated No. 20 among the nation's high schools by Roto magazine.

All afternoon, the Aquinas line outcharged the Warriors and tackled their fleet runners deep in the backfield or spilled them ignominiously along the sidelines. The colorful running of Bruce Costello, Kevin DeHond, Joe Mahar and Mike DiTroia piled up 262 yards against Erie's 124 yards. Quarterback Rich Parrinello threaded the needle with his passes four times for 92 yards.

It was a game of thrilling gambles with Aquinas daring to run or pass when a kick was expected and Erie spreading its line in an open formation that could lead to surprising end-sweeps or long passes. The battle was clean despite the hard fighting and the desperate, spirited play.

St. John Fisher College pitchers gained their third and fourth victories of the season last week with a pair of 7-0 wins over LeMayne on Thursday and Utica on Saturday. Their record is now 4-1.
