So, Adam and Eve Went up the Hill

If it's possible to see religious significance in popular songs, comic strips, films and TV shows that appear to have nothing at all to do with religion, it is just a matter of rhyme before someone takes a closer look at all those nursery stories.

But an English professor at the University of Connecticut has given us a tongue-in-cheek preview of what we might expect by offering "a close reading" of the nursery rhyme about Jack and Jill.

"We are far from dealing with a folk rhyme built with a highly sophisticated myth, rating the tragedy of the fall of man," according to Arthur Dalgton, an associate professor of English education, writing in "The Teachers Guide to Media and Methods."

His article is an apparent spoof of the trend that has, in recent years, produced "The Gospel According to Peanut," a book comparing James Bond to St. George, opinions on the religious value of "Bonanza" and the top-40 tunes, and plans for another book titled "The Gospel According to Gunsmoke."

"The symbolic implications in this seemingly simple folk rhyme are rather startling when it is subjected to close scrutiny," wrote Professor Dalgton about the rhyme which goes: "Jack and Jill went up the hill To fetch a pail of water. Jack fell down and broke his crown, And Jill came tumbling after."

When the "tools of scholarly research are employed towards the end of fuller exegesis" on these four lines, he commented, it can be seen that when Jack and Jill go up the hill, "obviously, they are involved in the myth of the Quest, the drive for Nirvana, the New Jerusalem, the road to immortality."

"The hill represents the disappointments, frustrations, the slings and arrows, and other such outrages which Dame Fortune bestows, uncollected, during the life of man."

"They go to fetch a pail of water. Possibly, their quest is for the Grail, the goal and ideal."
