



DC Catholics Ask Urban Coalition

Washington—(RNS)—Patrick Cardinal O'Boyle threw the weight of the Washington archdiocese behind efforts to cope with urban problems in Greater Washington and urged that the leadership of other Churches join a coalition of business, labor, educational and other area forces for "broad-based community support."

The Archbishop of Washington put special emphasis on housing, particularly rehabilitation projects in rundown areas of the capital. He pledged support "to do our share" in seeking to raise \$2 million in "front money" this fall so extensive housing programs can get under way.

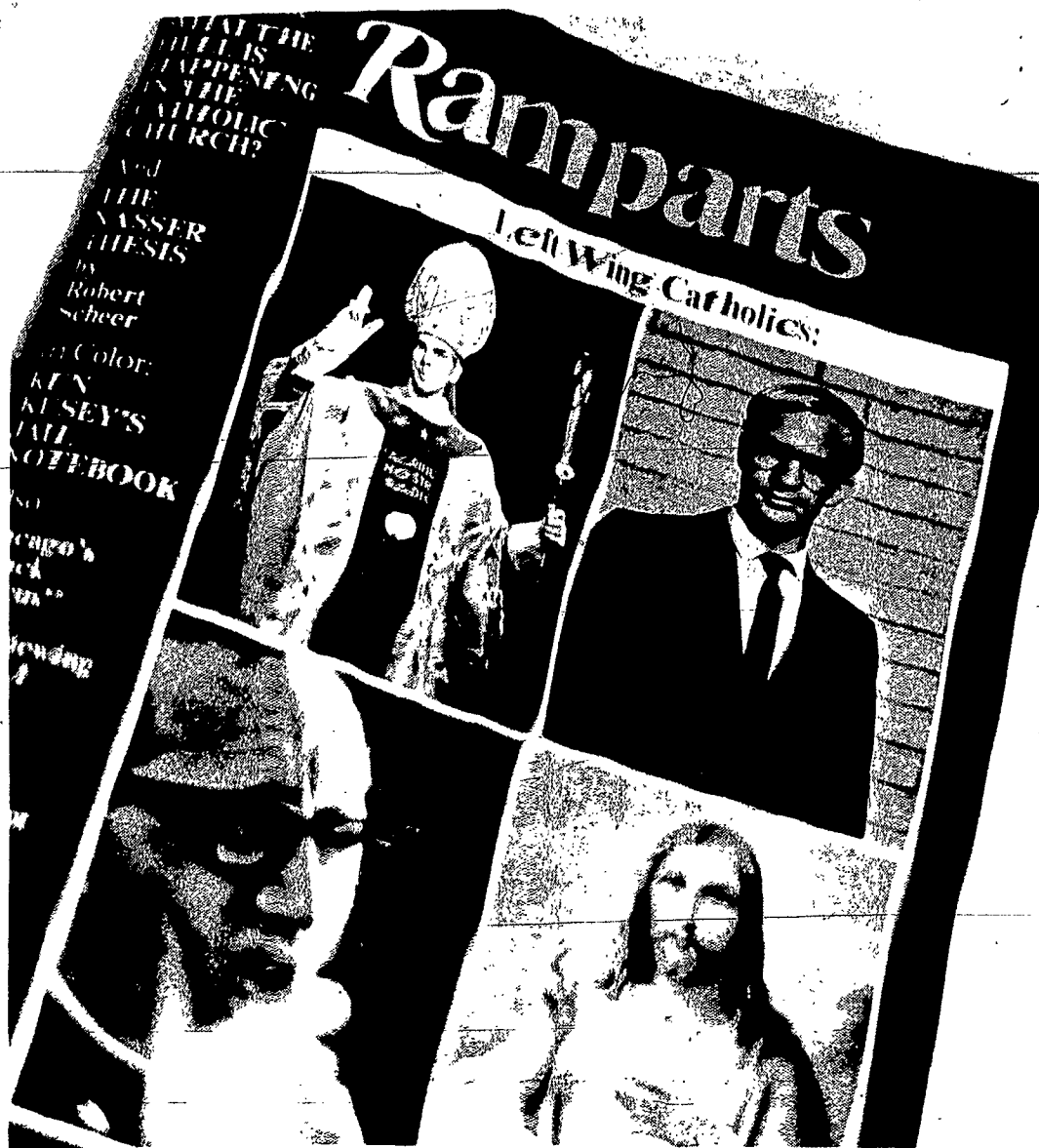
He told newsmen at a press conference that he is hopeful "Mayor" Walter Washington will give the call for such a coalition, similar to ones already in the organizing stage in about 50 American cities. Commissioner Washington soon will take charge of the city's government under a reorganization plan approved by Congress.

Cardinal O'Boyle cautioned against pride on the part of persons who will volunteer their efforts to the overall city projects envisioned through coalition and those projects done through their churches.
