Monroe County Property Taxes If New Constitution Adopted

LOOKING AT THE NEW constitution objectively we note that it does not call for the expenditure of a single cent. All spending is authorized by the legislature.

HOWEVER, THE NEW constitution has proposals that would spread the tax burden from local property taxes to the state income taxes so says State Comptroller Arthur Levitt. Since most state income taxes hit the higher salary brackets and big business, this would shift the tax burden to those who can most afford-it and alleviate the burden from the average wage-earner and home-owner particularly those retired people who are trying to maintain a home on a pension and social-security.

THIS PERCENTAGE is arrived at based on the current county budget which calls for a net welfare expenditure of \$7,623,000 out of \$22,953,000 overall raised by this year's county real estate tax.

THE ONLY ARGUMENT I have heard against the new constitution is that it shouldn't have been presented in one package. Any other way would have made a mockery of our delegates' good faith and ability to do the job that we elected them to do.

WE TRIED unsuccessfully to introduce two separate County Charters three years ago and both were beaten and there was only one point where the two differed, either one introduced separately had a good chance of passing. To present it as a single document took integrity and faith in the abilities of the framers of the new Constitution.

FROM ALL THE POLLS, letters to the editors, and opinions of various people the one big point is the Blaine Amendment in our present State Constitution. Certainly the people of New York-State deserve the same freedom of religion that is granted to the rest of the people of the United States by the supreme law of the land, our United States Constitution. In place of the Blaine Amendment in the new Constitution is an Amendment which is verbatim to the religious clause of the United States Constitution as established in the First Amendment, Article 1 of the Bill of Rights. This amendment forbids Congress to make any laws reflecting an establishment of a religion, etc.

BY VOTING FOR the new Constitution and repealing the Blaine Amendment we are voting for civil rights of all the children of New York State and the religious freedom of all the people. People who have studied the new Constitution are almost unanimous in their opinion that it is better than the one we now have.

So what are we waiting for? VOTE FOR IT.
