War Protest Endorsed

New York—(RNS)—Commonweal magazine, lay-edited Roman Catholic weekly, gave its editorial support to a statement by 28 Catholic writers, educators and publishers advocating civil disobedience in opposition to the Vietnam War.

The editorial, in its Oct. 27 issue, noted that two Commonweal staff members, Wilfrid Sheehy and Peter Steinfelds, participated "as individuals" in drafting the statement. But it added that the statement "is a logical projection of our own editorial positions. Accordingly, the signers have our support, both with regard to objectives and means."

The Lay magazine's stand is believed to be the first American Catholic statement in which civil disobedience is accepted as a legitimate form of anti-war protest.

Abortion Bill

Again in 1968

New York—(RNS)—Assembly Speaker Anthony J. Travia predicted that the controversial New York State abortion reform bill will be presented for a vote in the next legislative session.

Last session, the measure never came up for a vote. The bill was killed in the Assembly Codes Committee and Mr. Travia was widely blamed for the action. "I'm ready to take this head-on," he said of the abortion reform measure. "Let the Assembly see what it feels about it."

Joseph A. Polizzi, 28, son of Mr. and Mrs. Russell A. Polizzi, 82 Yorkshire Rd., Irondequoit, recently received the Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Sociology from Cornell University.

Dr. Polizzi's doctoral thesis was entitled, "Southern Italian Society: Its Peasantry and Change." Part of the research for the dissertation was executed while Polizzi was a Fulbright Scholar (1963-1964) affiliated with the Centro di Specializzazione Ricerche Economico-Agrarie per il Mezzogiorno in Naples, Italy.

Polizzi is a 1956 graduate of Aquinas Institute and received his bachelor's degree from St. John Fisher College in 1960. In 1962 he was awarded an M.A. degree in sociology from Fordham University in New York City. Presently, Polizzi is an assistant professor of sociology and education at St. John Fisher College.
