

Aquinas Blanks Auburn Faces Erie Prep Tonight

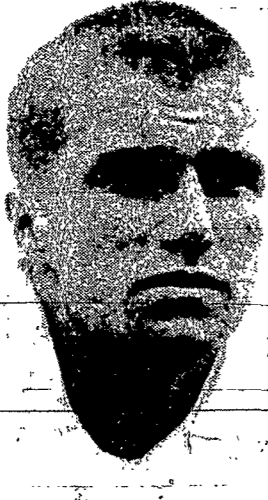

Coach Bob Rosmarino's Aquinas grid machine should be ready for the "really big one" tonight in Erie when the Little Irish meet highly touted Erie Prep.

Any defensive or offensive rough spots may have been apparent earlier when well ironed out as the Irish ripped and tore through the heart of the Auburn line. The Irish, playing in a cold drizzle before some 3,000 cold, shivering fans, exploded immediately after the opening whistle and it was a romp from there in Final tally was 40-0.

The Irish, now 4-1, will enter tonight's game an underdog for the first time this season. A backward glance at last Saturday's devastation might indicate an upset is in order, however. And if Bruce Costello continues to improve as he has every game all season, then Erie Prep had better look out.

Costello, a clever, hard-hitting carrier, cut loose on several man-sized running plays against the Maroons. By game's end he had carried the ball 16 times for a gain of 167 yards, better than 10 yards a carry. As if that weren't enough, he carried

The ball to pay dirt four times to boost his total TD record of the season to 10.

Don Northrup started the Aquinas action by intercepting and Auburn pass on the very

first play from scrimmage. Costello went off tackle for 2 yards, Rich Parrinello picked up ten yards sprinting around end and then Costello scooted 9 yards for the first six points of the game. Golden toe John Amenti, in Gogolak fashion, converted for the extra point.

Late in the first period Aquinas marched from the 12 yard line in ten plays to their own 46. On the next play Parrinello faded, couldn't find a receiver open, then streaked 46 yards for a touchdown.

Costello cashed in the next three tallies on runs of 20, 13 and 45 yards. Amenti connected on two of the three attempts.

An Auburn fumble recovered by Tom DiNolfo set up the final score of the game. Mike Skivington, assisted by Greg Dolan and Doug Miller, moved the ball from the Aquinas 31 yard line to the Auburn 4 in 13 plays. Skivington bucked over for TD. Amenti split the uprights to give Aquinas its first shutout of the season.

Aquinas concludes its grid season on Sunday, Nov. 12 against Bishop Kearney High School.

Edison — The injury-ridden Notre-Dame-Crusaders opened playing relations with Thomas Edison Saturday night at Notre Dame. Edison defeated ND by a 14-0 count.

Edison scored on a 35 yard pass from Zane Palmer to Bob Kutz in the second quarter and on a 63 yard run by Andy Shaw in the fourth stanza. Fran Dougherty made both extra points.

Notre Dame's offense sputtered in mounting only one serious drive all night. The Crusaders have scored only seven points in four outings since star Bill Baker received his season-ending injury.

Edison now stands 3-4 on the year while the Crusaders now have a 1-5-1 mark. Notre Dame ends the 1967 campaign Saturday afternoon against Towanda at 2 p.m.

Kearney is Favorite In Tomorrow's Title Meet

Bishop Kearney High will be favored to capture its first varsity diocesan cross-country title this Saturday at Watkins Glen where the 8th Annual Diocesan Championship Meet gets underway at 11:15 a.m.

The Kings, with four invitational titles to their credit plus two seconds in large meets, have been consistent as a close running group all season. That consistency should get them past upset-minded squads from McQuaid and Aquinas, completing the varsity field over

the hilly 2.3 mile course will be teams from Cardinal Mooney, Mt. Carmel of Auburn, and host school—Padua—High.

Bossert Trophy

A memorial trophy honoring the memory of school-boy cross-country champion will be presented tomorrow to the school capturing the annual Rochester Diocesan Cross-Country meet.

The trophy will bear the name of Robert R. Bossert, former Aquinas Institute athlete and midshipman at the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis. Bossert was killed in a plane crash in 1955 while on naval maneuvers off the coast of Florida.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard J. Bossert of 580 Conkey Ave.

Bossert captained the Aquinas Cross-Country team in 1963 and that same year won the Diocesan Track Championship for the two mile event.

Bob Bossert was only 17 when he graduated from Aquinas and entered Annapolis. An outstanding competitor on the field and an honor student throughout high school, he won an appointment to the Naval Academy before graduation.

Kearney and McQuaid are expected to battle it out for the meet's other two trophies in the junior varsity and freshman divisions. Aquinas is defending champion at varsity level, while McQuaid plays that role in the other two races.

Mooney Over Batavia, 25-0

Cardinal Mooney's late blooming football machine swept to its third straight win last week, downing Batavia High, 25-0. The Cards have dropped their first three games, but have come back strong in mid-season.

Co-Captain Dick Parker bolted over from the 4-yard marker in the first quarter, and Terry Freeman's 50-yard jaunt in the second period gave the winners a 12-0 halftime bulge. The Mooney defense was staunch all through the game. Linebackers Bob Merkel and Mike Bunting led one defensive charge after another to stop the Batavia backs in their tracks.

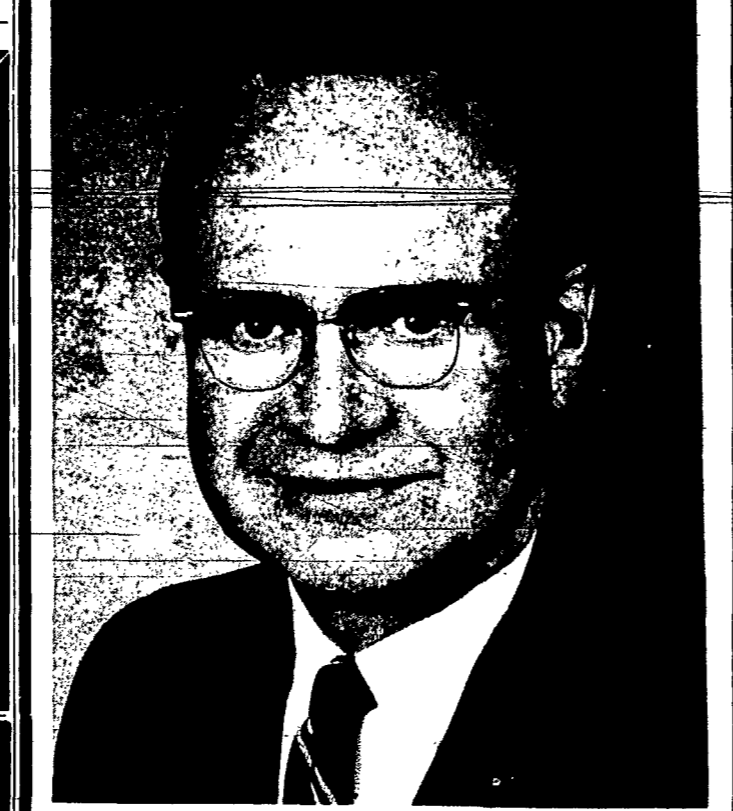
