

Aquinas Ties Erie Prep, Faces Kearney Sunday

A 17-year old 169-pound half-back who delights in running head on into bulkier linemen to get them out of the way will be Aquinas' "marked man" when the Little Irish of Aquinas meet the Bishop Kearney Kings Sunday afternoon at Aquinas Stadium.

He's Bruce Costello, a hard-driving senior who was a one-man gang last Friday evening in Erie as Aquinas gained a 26-22 tie over highly favored Erie Prep. Aquinas now stands 4-1 for the season.

Costello carried the ball 24 times for 183 yards, an average of 7.6 yards per trip as quarter-back Rich Parrinello time and again relied on the ripping, plunging back. Costello accounted for three of Aquinas' four touchdowns.

The Irish went ahead for the first time in the game at 9:40 of the last quarter when Costello dove over from the 1 following a 73 yard march.

Prep countered with a 68 yard march. The TD came on a 32 yard pass by Steenberge to Jeff Trombacco. John Brophy blocked the PAT try.

Aquinas posted its last six points in championship fashion. The Irish ran the kick back to the Erie 37. Costello and Mike DiTroia moved the ball 9 yards on the next three downs. On a fourth down, and one situation Costello took the ball, hit the line — and streaked 55 yards for another TD to put Aquinas ahead 26-19 with 3:32 remaining.

In desperation Erie took to the air. With the ball on his 28, Steenberge fired to Trombacco

who made it to the 11. Steenberge took it over from the one to tie up the game 26-26 with 1:27 showing on the clock.

The Kearney Kings, upset-minded and quite possibly equipped to turn the trick, will try their hand at turning back Bob Rosmarino's Irish.

In 1965, the first year the two schools met, Bishop Kearney upset Aquinas 39-14. Last year, out for revenge, the Irish blanked the Kings, 20-0.

Moreover, Coach Dan Coughlin's charges have been beset by tough breaks all season. He has a big club, well coached and ready to explode. Back at full strength now, there's no telling what the Kings may do.

Game time is set for 2 p.m. The bands of both schools will perform at halftime.

for the course in an Erie Prep Aquinas game. Last year Prep nudged the Irish, 28-27. The previous year Prep scored in the last nine seconds to win 33-26.

Prep opened the scoring when quarter-back Pat Steenberge plunged over from the 1 following an interception by Chuck Britton. Dave Krahe booted the PAT for a 7-0 Erie lead with 7:21 remaining in the half.

Aquinas fired back quickly. Costello returned a Prep punt to the 31. On the next two plays Costello picked up ten yards for a first down. Parrinello carried for 4 yards and then hit John DePeters for another 11. Costello then broke through tackle and dashed 43 yards to pay dirt. John Amonte picked up the PAT to tie the game 7-7 with 5:08 remaining in the second quarter.

The Ramblers marched from their own 26 in 9 plays, aided by the fantastic running of Jerry Mifsud, to score with 50 seconds remaining on the clock before the half.

Aquinas deadlocked the game again early in the third period. John Brophy intercepted an Erie pass on the 42 and returned it 25 yards. Two plays later Parrinello shot 13 yards to tie up the game at 13-13.

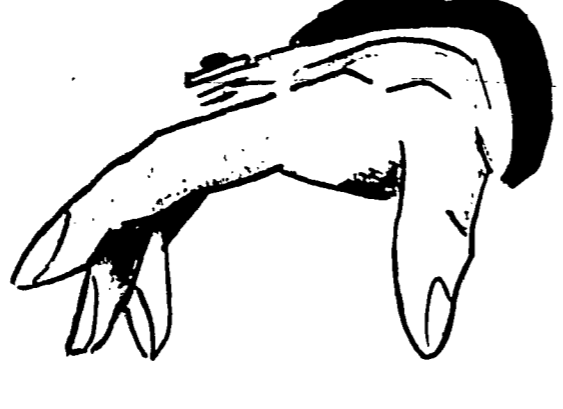
