Custer Series Said Rousing Old Hatreds

Eau Claire, Wis. — (RNS)—Bishop William W. Horstick of the Eau Claire Episcopal diocese has requested clergy and people of his diocese to join in protesting the showing of a new television series on the life and adventures of Gen. George Custer.

Bishop Horstick said he was acting in response to an appeal from Vine V. Deloria, archdeacon for the Episcopal Church in South Dakota and director of the National Congress of American Indians.

"We American Indians desperately need your help, instantly and vigorously," the appeal said.

"This series must not go on TV," the communication said. "It would cause irreparable damage to the image of Indians as human beings and as people trying to join the modern technological world through economic development. All of the old hatreds of Indians would come to the surface."

In another protest, Mr. Deloria referred to Gen. Custer as "the Adolph Eichmann of the 19th Century."

"The show is not historically true, he declared. We don't want the younger generation picking up whole series of falsehoods and half-truths. We are trying to live down stereotypes from all types of modern programs and find this show highly objectionable."

Anglican Says Mass Prayers

Aylesford — (NC)—An Anglican bishop read the prayers of the faithful at an outdoor consecrated Mass at the Carmelite friary here at which Catholic Archbishop Cyril C. Cowdroy was invested with the pallium. The pallium, a band of white wool ornamented with crosses and worn on the shoulders, is a symbol of the fullness of the episcopacy presented by the Pope.

The prayers read by Anglican Bishop Mervyn Stockwood of Southwark included a prayer for the Pope and one asking God's blessing "on all those united in Christian Baptism." The Anglican bishop also commended all of God's people to the intercession of "Our Blessed Lady, the glorious and ever-virgin Mother of God."

During the Mass the Anglican bishop used a throne on the Epistle side of the altar.

Missions Face New Dangers

Berlin—(RNS)—The Roman Catholic Church faces a "dangerous situation" in some nations of "Asia, Africa and elsewhere," the German hierarchy said in a pastoral letter urging greater support of missionary efforts.

In many developing countries, the letter said, there is a danger that the "young Churches" may be "regarded as the last remnants of hated colonialism and that, through the possible expulsion of missionaries the indigenous Churches may be pushed to the brink of collapse."
