What value does a parochial school have in today's society?

The value of a parochial school education goes far beyond the "three little angels plus two little angels equals five little angels" of the arithmetic book. The parochial school tries to integrate the teaching of religion into the child's whole life.

As the name suggests, a "parochial" school is connected with a parish. Consequently, it is able to offer the various activities connected with parish life to make religion more meaningful. Many parishes select their altar boys from children in their school. Oftentimes, there is a school choir which sings at church functions. A scout troop based at a parish school is oriented toward Christian ideals. The school can encourage its pupils to attend Mass frequently, to help the missions (a good practice to begin at an early age) and to assist the priest and different parish activities.

The parochial school does not teach a "Time Magazine" type of religion, that is — religion as a definite section of one's personal life with no effect on other aspects. Rather, parochial schools make religion permeate a student's life.

## Poor Man's Priest Called A Communist

Santa Fe, Argentina — (NC) — Father Arturo Paoli, who in seven years changed a downtrodden group of woodcutters into independent farmers, is now being accused of associating with communist guerrillas.

The charges come from the landowners of Fortin Olmos, a wild forest in the upper Parana river basin. The landowners have lost cheap labor to the farmers' cooperative started by Father Paoli.

"It is crazy to call me a communist or to say that I am helping the guerrillas. I could not do so and still be saying Mass and preaching the Gospel," Father Paoli has answered.

The priest has been in the news again with the publication of his book, "The Person and the World and God," which draws its doctrine mainly from the writings of French philosophers and theologians such as Jacques Maritain and the late Father Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, S.J.

## Prelate Hears Birch Priest

Milwaukee — (NC) — Auxiliary Bishop Roman A. Atkieski of Milwaukee was among 22 area clergymen who attended a closed meeting sponsored by the Milwaukee Chapter of the John Birch Society.

Addressing the group on the work of the society was Father Francis F. Fenton, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Bridgeport, Conn., and a member of the Birch Society's national council.

The meeting was held at Christ the King School, Wauwatosa, Wis., and a reporter from the Milwaukee Journal was requested to leave before Father Fenton's talk.

Bishop Atkieski said the John Birch Society is "an American organization that is trying to alert the people as to what is happening in the world" and that Father Fenton discussed the ways it does this and answered questions.

## China Feast A Holy Day

Hong Kong — (NC) — Ching Ming, a day on which Chinese families visit the graves of their ancestors, will now appear on the Catholic calendar here as an occasion for a Mass for the Dead.

This blending of traditional Chinese customs with Church solemnities is part of a new series of directives for the Hong Kong diocese. Ching Ming, one of the five major festivals of the Chinese year, has a movable place on the calendar but usually occurs near Easter.
