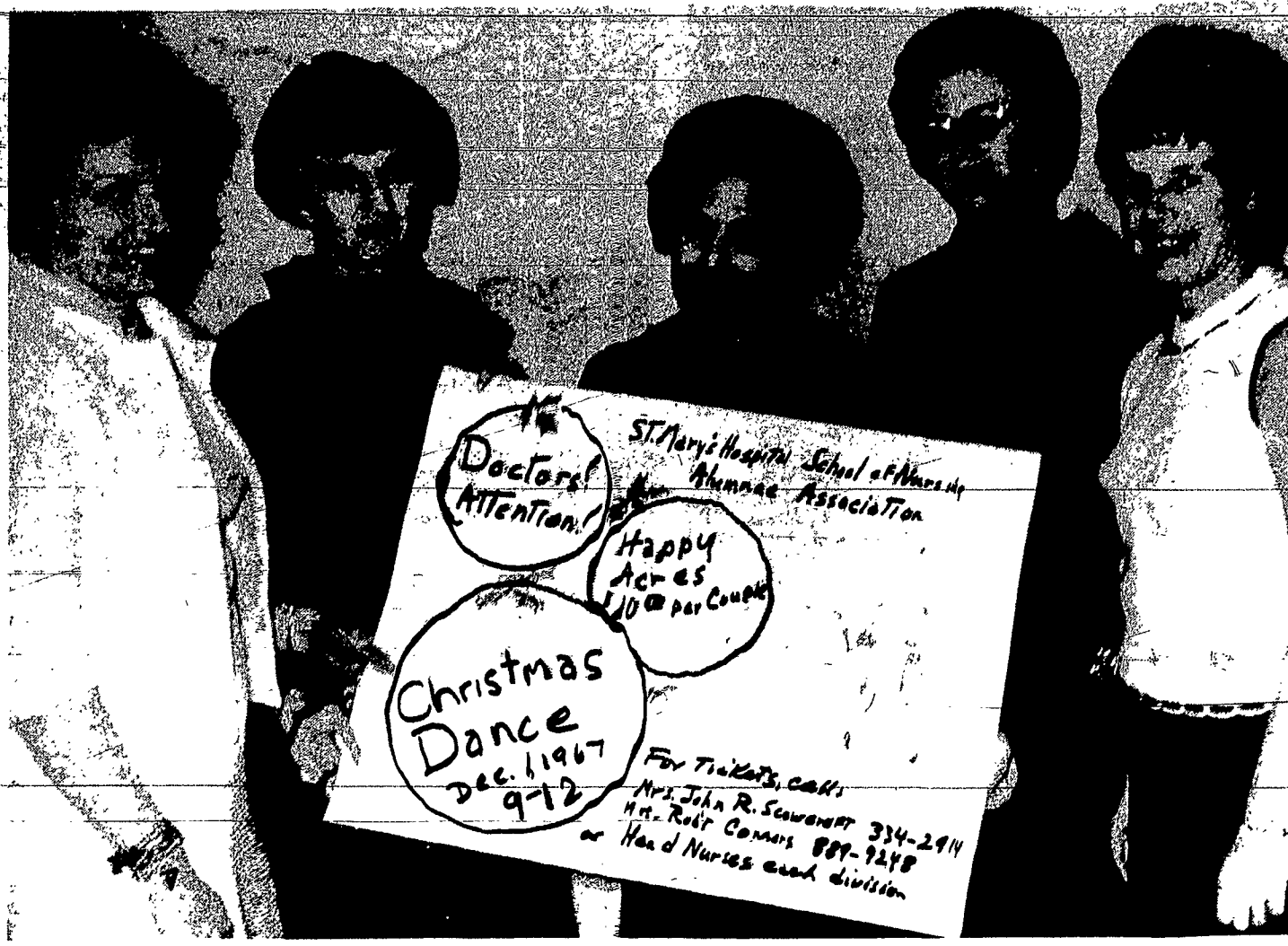

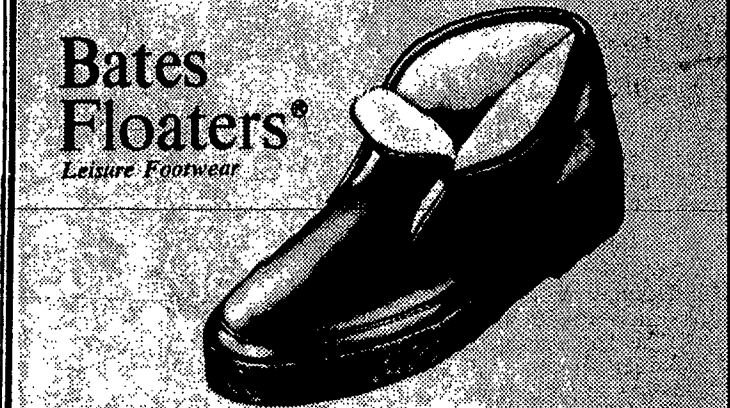

Rochester will lose one favorite nurse soon because she has been elected Mother of the American nation of her religious order.

Mother Mary of the Immaculate Conception Garry, has headed the Holy Home for girls with proficiency since 1954, is the nun.

The Winton Road North has eleven sisters on its currently is educating an average of 30 girls.

As Mother President of Sisters of Our Lady of Refuge, Mother Imma (as she's called for simplicity) will be the overall head of the Holy Home in the United States and one in Edmonton, Alberta, which comprise the American Federation of her group will have some 300 nuns her jurisdiction.

She expects to leave Rochester by this year's end to reside in Wisconsin, Wisconsin. Her federation recently located its Administration Center and plans a novitiate there in the future.

Mother Immaculate was to Rochester in 1932 on a temporary assignment to help organize the girls school at Angels Home. With the death of three years as mistress at her group, Aurora convent, 1944, she has been in Rochester since.

"My temporary assignment here has spanned 35 years reflected this week.

She entered the convent in 1922, and now after 45 years a sister, faces the large challenge of her religious name be removed from the ballot for Mother Superior. "We really have so much to do right here," she says in the election serenely as style.

said that financial difficulties are forcing the closing. The hospital, she reported, has operated at a loss since opening in 1989.

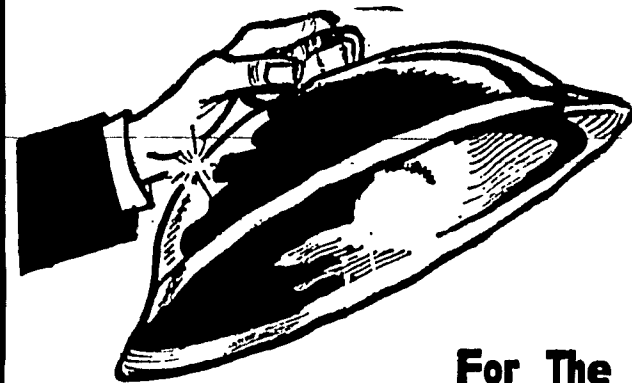
**Last of the Brides End of November**

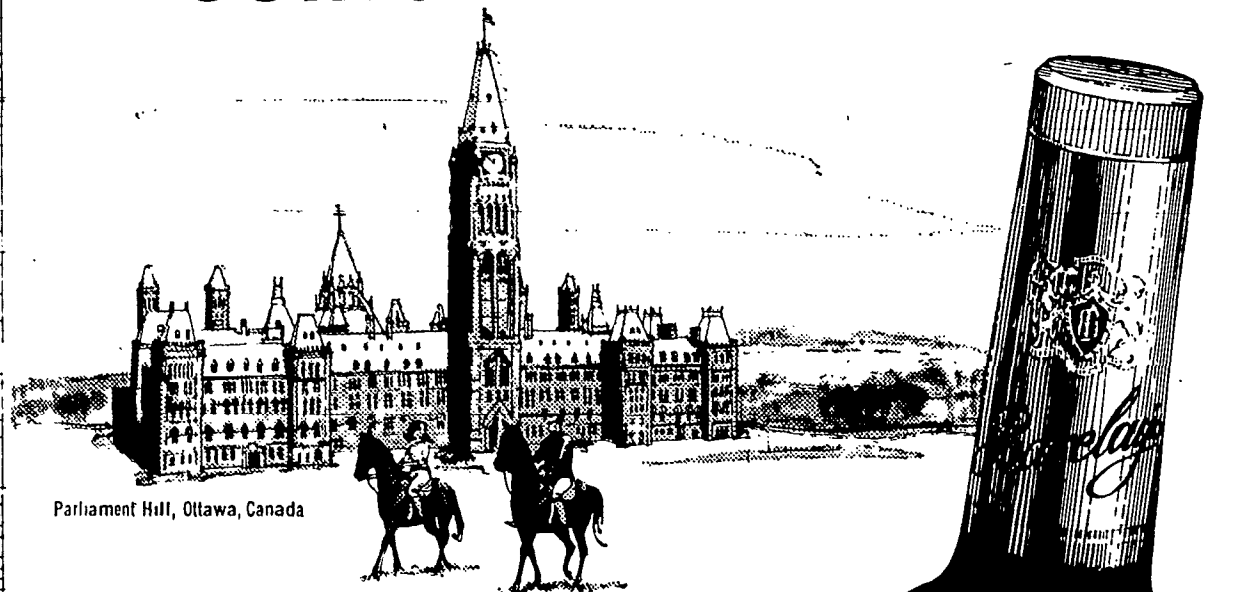
