## Arts Center Holds Open House

Nazareth College extends an invitation to parishioners of all Catholic parishes in the diocese of Rochester, as well as all other contributors to the Joint College Fund, to Open House in the new Arts Center on Sun., Nov. 19 from 2 to 5 p.m.

Students will act as guides to the visitors on conducted tours of the three buildings in the complex which house the Art, Music, and Speech and Drama Departments.

Of special interest will be the unusual design of the 1150-seat theatre and the facilities of the Speech Therapy unit.

Music and art studios will also be open for inspection and the exhibit of the Masters of Abstraction from the Downtown Gallery in New York City may be viewed in the lobby of the theater, which serves as the main gallery for the Art Department.

The final performance of Othello by the Nazareth-St. John Fisher dramatic group will be given on the same Sunday evening. Open House visitors may obtain tickets in the Arts Center box office.

## Aquinas Band: 'Excellent'

Aquinas Institute's marching band received a standing ovation from over 12,000 spectators in Philadelphia's Civic Center last Saturday evening. The occasion was the annual Parade of Champions sponsored by Cardinal Dougherty High School, the world's largest Catholic high school. It has an enrollment of over 5,600 students.
