**No CIA Interviews
For Georgetown U.**

Washington — (NC) — The Central Intelligence Agency, whose recruiters have been the targets of student protests at many colleges, has cancelled a scheduled recruiting visit to Jesuit-run Georgetown University.

Interested students have instead been invited to visit CIA offices a mile away across the Potomac in Arlington, Va.

A CIA spokesman told the university that the change in plans was "not a direct response" to anticipated campus protests. Instead, said the spokesman, the change would be "more convenient" for Washington area students to visit the CIA offices.
