Dear POP Friends,

If your home was the scene of the family Thanksgiving dinner, your refrigerator is probably filled with leftovers. Pack some of your own TV dinners, and dress up the remaining turkey in this tasty casserole.

POP Turkey with Noodles

- 2 cups diced turkey
- 1/2 cup blanched almonds
- 6 tbs. Land O'Lakes Butter
- 4 tbs. flour
- 1 cup turkey or chicken broth
- 1 cup heavy cream
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1/2 lb. Prince medium noodles

Cook noodles until tender; drain and rinse with cold water. Brown almonds in 2 tbs. Land O'Lakes Butter and set aside. Melt 4 tbs. Land O'Lakes Butter in skillet and stir in flour. Remove from heat and slowly add broth, stirring constantly. Slowly add cream and cook over low heat, stirring constantly until thick and smooth. Arrange noodles in 2 qt. baking dish. Arrange turkey over noodles, and sprinkle with browned almonds; pour white sauce over all and cover. Bake at 350 F. for 30 minutes. Serve with asparagus, broccoli, or French green beans. Serves 6.



Some Rochesterians may remember the delicious chicken croquettes once served at the popular Odenbach's. If you still have a yen for this dish, why not concoct your own... with leftover turkey on hand, you can use this in place of chicken, and the following sauce will add even more to their appeal:

Turkey Croquettes with Fruit Sauce

Croquettes:

- 1 cup milk
- 4 tbs. flour
- 3 tbs. Blue Bonnet Whipped Margarine
- 2 cups turkey pieces
- 2 tbs. ground onion
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- Dash of pepper
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tbs. sugar
- 1 tbs. Sherry

Breading:

- 1 egg
- 2 tbs. milk
- 2 cups bread crumbs

Sauce:

- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1—#2 1/2 can Fruit Cocktail
- 1/4 tsp. mint extract
- 2 tbs. Sherry

Melt Blue Bonnet Margarine in saucepan; add flour slowly. Add hot milk to form a heavy cream sauce. Grind turkey and onions, using medium blade (or chop in blender). Add lemon juice and remaining ingredients. Add cream sauce to turkey mixture. Refrigerate until well chilled. Form into croquettes; dip in egg/milk mixture, then bread crumbs. Fry in deep fat at 375 F. until nicely browned.

Drain juice from fruit, and add sherry and enough water or other juice to make 1 cup liquid. Combine sugar in heavy pan; add liquid and cook slowly until a thick syrup is formed. Cool slightly, and add fruit cocktail and mint extract. Top with fruit sauce. Complete the meal with broccoli or fresh asparagus. (8 servings)



Of course there's always the possibility that your Thanksgiving goodies were practically demolished on the big day... no leftovers to worry about, but no leftovers to "make do with" either! If this is the case, you'll want something that's economical, quick and easy to prepare. Here's the answer:

Spud 'n' Nugget Bake

- 4 cups sliced potatoes
- 1 lb. Maplecrest Skinless Frankfurters
- 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- 2 tbs. finely chopped onion
- Bread crumbs; Blue Bonnet Margarine

Cook potatoes until slightly tender. Cut Maplecrest Frankfurters crosswise into 1/2 inch "coins". Combine soup, milk, cheese and onion. In a greased baking dish alternate layers of potatoes, frankfurters and soup mixture, seasoning potatoes with salt and pepper. Top with bread crumbs and dot generously with Blue Bonnet Margarine. Bake at 350 F. for 30 minutes. Serves 8.

For a vegetable accompaniment serve Speed Carrots. Drain a 1 lb. can of sliced carrots. Combine 2 tbs. of the liquid with 1 tbs. Land O'Lakes Butter, and 1/4 tsp. mace or nutmeg. Add to drained carrots, heat and season with salt to taste.

Marists Test New Method

New York — (RNS) — "No more classrooms, no more books" may symbolize the future of Catholic religious education, according to the provincial of the Marist brothers, one of the major teaching orders in the U.S.

Four lay Brothers living in a rented Presbyterian manse, in LaPorte, Indiana, and conducting teenage discussions of underground movies and filling in as substitute teachers in public high schools — are pioneering an experiment that promises a radical answer to the crisis in Catholic education.

In announcing the experiment, Brother Kieran Brennan, provincial of the 655-member order of brothers who have been innovators in Catholic schools in the past, revealed that the Marists will accept no more assignments to conventional Catholic schools.

They will continue to serve 34 parochial schools throughout the country, including seven high schools in New York City. But new assignments for the U.S. branch of the teaching order will fulfill "a man-

date for experimentation in education" which Brother Brennan received at the recent Marist international chapter meeting in Rome.

The LaPorte experiment placed four men, in their 30's or younger and all equipped with masters degrees, apart from their normal religious communities. Their initial work will develop novel techniques of religious instruction for teenagers who attend the city's public high school.

"The Brothers are developing the media of the contemporary world as the basis for teaching religion," explained Brother Brennan. "Beginning with current movies, novels, avant-garde literature, items from newspapers, and modern records, the Brothers will involve the teenagers in discussions. From these they will draw the moral and religious implications which produce the foundation of mature adult life."

The discussions, the provincial continued, will take place

in the residence of the Brothers, in the homes of the teenagers and wherever else the young religious can meet with teenagers on the young people's own terms.

Efforts are being made, he said, to cooperate with Protestant ministers in the town and to include non-Catholic youngsters in discussions.

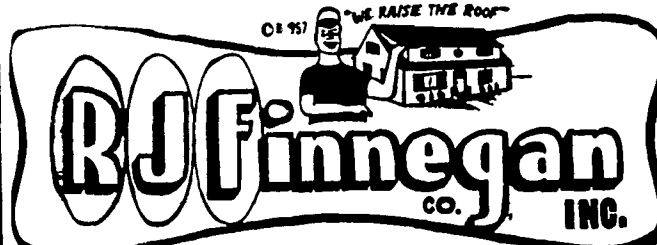
