## 900 Sign Up For CYO Basketball

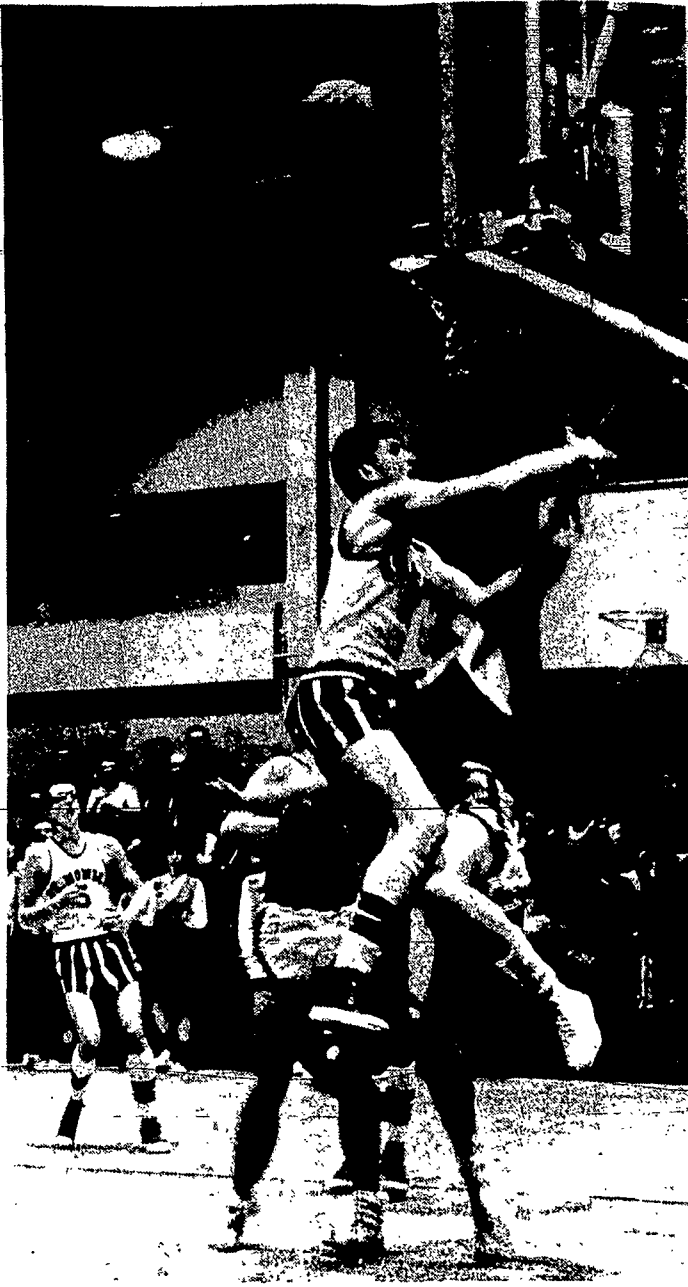

Providing the opposition for the Trotters will be the Washington Generals, coached by the ageless Louis "Red" Klotz.

At the helm of the Trotters this season are three new owners — Foster Palmer, George Gillett and John O'Neil. Work on the theory that you don't break up a winning combination.

During the past 41 years, the Trotters have posted a record of 8,800 triumphs against 322 defeats, achieved in 87 countries on 6 continents, indicating they can play good, sound basketball as well as provide more

comedy in one night than most performers can in a week.

Directing the Trotters on Saturday night at the War Memorial will be Coach Bobby Milton—17 year veteran with the Club. As usual, the top Trotter to watch is incomparable Meadowlark Lemon backed by standouts Freddie Neal, Bobby Hunter, Bobby Joe Mason and 6'10" Frank Stephens.

The accompanying 5 act variety show is designed to entertain the whole family and is comprised of a fine assemblage of artists from all over the world.

## Track Season Nears End At Batavia Downs Oval

Batavia — Night harness racing which has drawn more than one million spectators at two Western New York tracks in the past 8½ months draws to a close here at Batavia Downs next weekend.

The local fall meeting ends Saturday, Dec. 2 with the presentation of top driver awards. Racing will resume early next March.

Batavia's big all-weather racing plant will have drawn over 750,000 customers in just under six months of activity. Buffalo Raceway played host to over 400,000 fans during three summer months.

Two weekends of action remain at Batavia and \$3,000 free-for-all tests for the best resident trotters and pacers will highlight these race cards.

Top driver awards will probably go to Eldon Hanover, leader in percentage throughout most of the four month fall meeting, and Del Manges, holding a slight edge in races won for the second straight season.

Aquinas Institute students and their dads will team up early in December to take part in the school's first annual Father and Son Bowling Tournament.

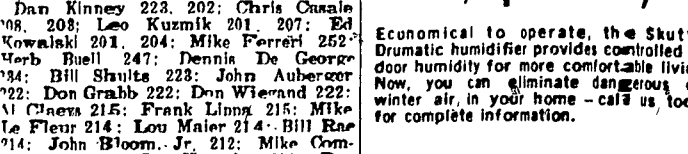
The tournament is sponsored by the student activities committee of APACE, an Aquinas parents organization. Adolph D'Etore is chairman, assisted by Jack Wilder.

## Aquinas Opens Against East Rochester Quint

Watch out for the Aquinas Institute basketball team this season.

New head coach Jerry McGuire is blessed with 3 returning starters and 7 returning lettermen. Last year under Jack Kelly the Little Irish were 10 and 9 for the season.

How well Aquinas will do this season may be determined Saturday night (Nov. 25) when the Irish meet the East Rochester Bombers on the latter's court. It will be sort of a homecoming for McGuire who headed the town's Catholic Youth Association before moving to Aquinas.

Overall, the team shows height, experience and shooters who could make the Irish one of the top contenders for the Diocesan cage crown.

Coming back are a whole flock of players who will be battling for starting jobs. The leading returning point-maker is Jim Brady who averaged better than 12 points a game last season and led the team in total points. He also accounted for 9 rebounds per game.
