Bp. Kearney Addresses Notre Dame Retreatants

Annual meeting for officers, parish leaders, co-leaders and interested retreatants will be conducted at Notre Dame Retreat House, Canandaigua on Dec. 3, it was announced by Father Richard Moran, C.S.S.R. retreat master speaking at Bath, N.Y., Nov. 19.

BISHOP KEARNEY will address the group.

Father Moran at the Bath meeting spoke to the 20 officers representing nine parishes of the Steuben County Laymen's Retreat League. He reported that since Jan. 1, 1967, 3,587 persons have made weekend retreats at the "Tower of Grace" overlooking Canandaigua Lake. He said that 160 persons of various faiths have participated in discussion group meetings.

The Redemptorist priest cited the benefits of a weekend retreat. He described it as a time to withdraw from the everyday problems of life and said it provides time to consider the progress of one's spiritual life. It is an opportunity, he said, to learn of the layman's obligation in carrying out the documents of Vatican II in regards to the Liturgy and the decree on the Apostolate of the Laity.

VICTOR GESSNER, Wayland, vice president of the League spoke on the importance of the monthly meeting starting with the five-month meeting and regular monthly meeting, down to the last monthly meeting prior to the actual retreat. He said that it is most important for workers to attend these meetings and that each man in the parish should be personally invited to make the retreat.

Gessner announced the next meeting for the Steuben County Laymen's Retreat group will be at St. Mary's School, Bath at 2:30 p.m., Sunday, Feb. 18. All parish leaders and co-leaders were urged to attend.

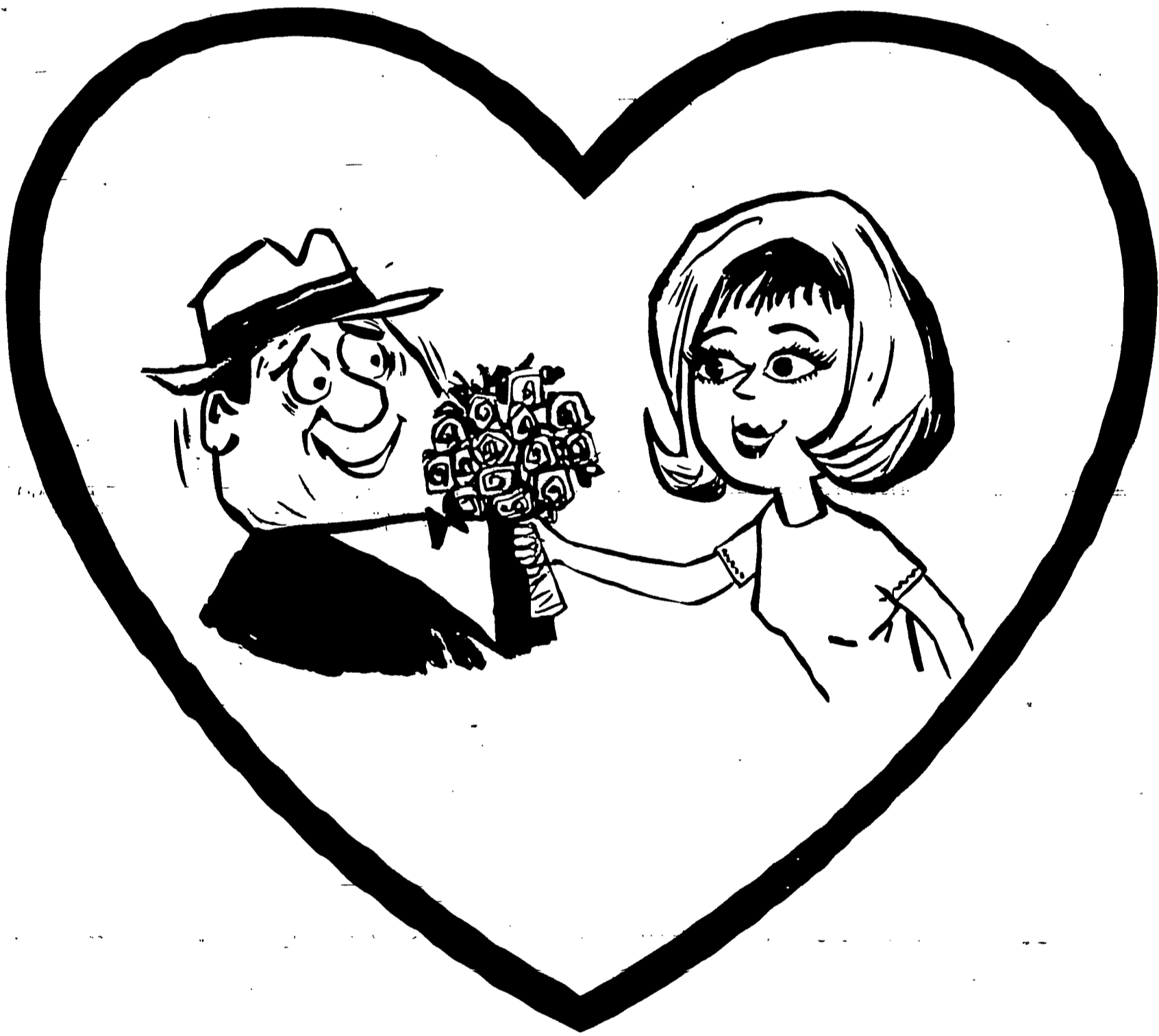

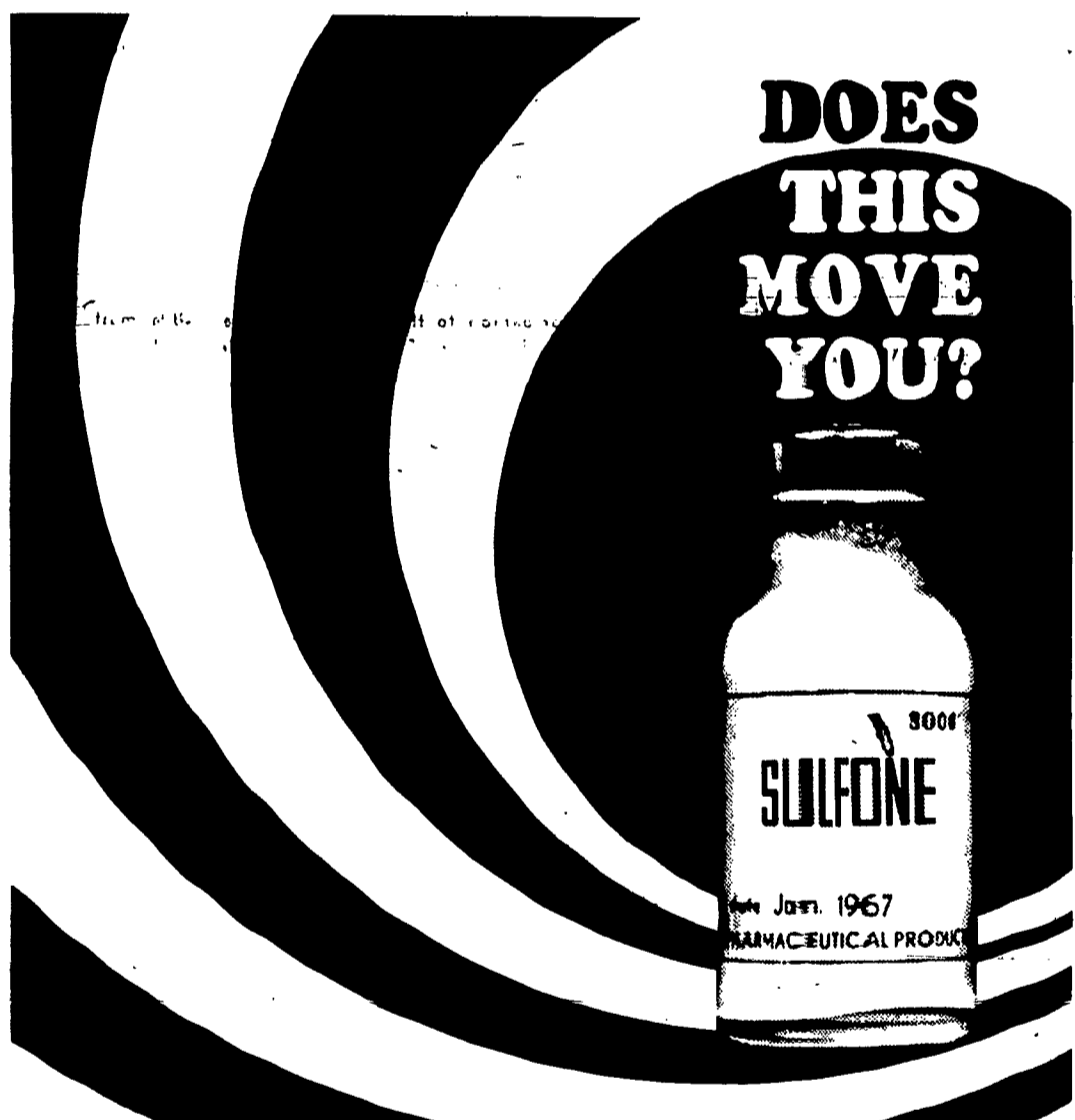
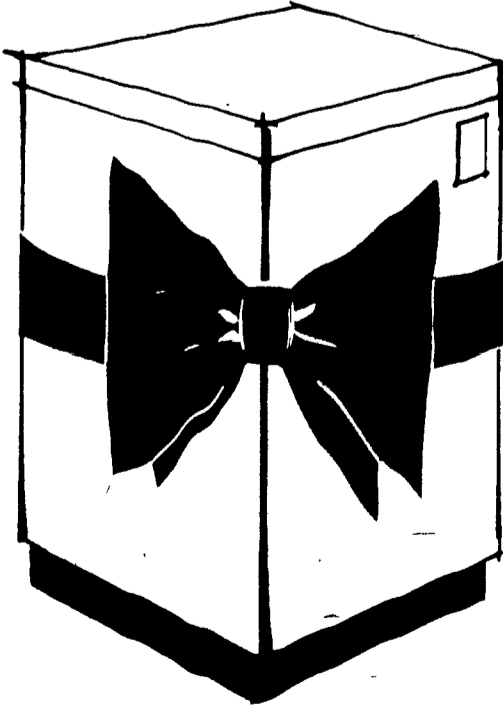
