New York-(RNS)-The first adult television presentation of the Lutheran Church in Ameri-ca has been released to U.S. stations and 27 stations have scheduled the 30-minute program.

"The Anikeeper," which uses live ants as actors for half the program, was written and di-rected by Rolf Forsberg of Chicago, whose controversial film "Parable" has won numerous religious and film festival awards.

Release of the show was through the offices of council broadbasters in major cities and with the cooperation of the Broadcasting and Film Commission of the National Council of Churches.
