

St. Thomas Starts Fast in CYO Ball

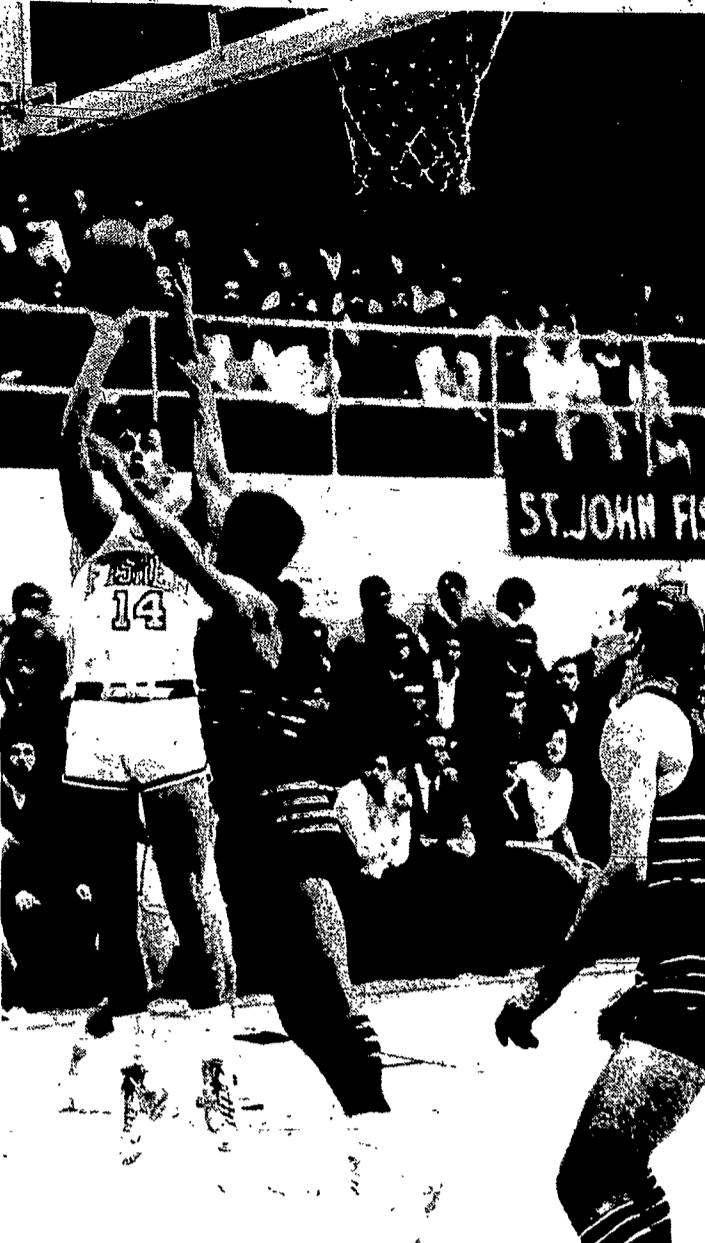
