Triple Orange Cake 1 cup Land O'Lakes Butter or Blue Bonnet Margarine

- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 isp. triple sec or other orange liqueur 2 cups sifted all purpose flour
- 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1 tsp. baking powder
