Father Walas, Former Pastor of St. Theresa's

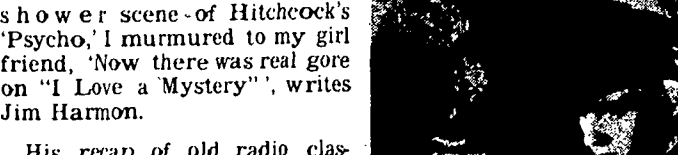
Father Ambrose Walas, O.F.M. Conv., a recent pastor of St. Theresa's Church 14 Mark St., died Sunday, Dec. 10, in St. Michael's Friary, Bridgeport, Conn.

He left here in September, after a serious illness.

The funeral was held yesterday, Dec. 14, in Baltimore, Md.

Father Walas was born in Baltimore, Feb. 4, 1910, and was ordained to the priesthood in 1934. He served as chaplain of the Sacred Heart Home Sanatorium of the Brothers of Mercy at Clarence before his assignment here. During his tenure a \$75,000 debt was paid and the interior of St. Theresa's was renovated.

He is survived by a niece, Mrs. Elmer Smith.

Prelate Bucks Cut In Family Subsidy

Muenster, Germany — (NC) — Julius Cardinal Döpfner of Munich has written to German Chancellor Kurt Georg Kiesinger to protest against government proposals to reduce family allowances.

Earlier, at the annual congress of the Catholic Worker Movement in Berlin, Joseph Stingl of Berlin, a Christian Democratic member of the German parliament, had said that he regretted that the Church did not concern itself more with government moves to reduce the family allowances.

'Register' Hits Dogmatism

Denver — (RNS) — The Register's discussion, reading, and further weekly published here, has editorially criticized the "dogmatic" stand taken by some Catholic publication on the war in Viet for discussion.

—"At this already last stage, has the U.S. adopted a concrete, mutually acceptable plan for on a vastly complicated war," the Register stated. "Few, if any, of us can fill the role of the Vietnam authority."

"We think the reader is served better in this complex situation by the presentation of pointed questions, to which Vietnam answers can be sought through unless we make some positive gesture of de-escalation?"

—"In this light, have we given to the pursuit of peace the same effort and consistency we have given to prosecuting the war?"

—"What effect will the continuation of the war have on the many needed programs in this country?"

—"And finally, if we were to win the war militarily what assurance would we have of a peace victory any more than if we now relentlessly pursued negotiations while consolidating our position in the most populous areas of the South?"
