"This is really an economical venture, as 40% of our students are non-Catholics now," Mrs. Lancer volunteered.

Church, Rites Group Contest Draft

The National Council of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) in challenging reclassification of three clergymen who have turned in their draft cards to protest the Viet Nam war.

Father David Connor, Catholic associate chaplain at Cornell, is one of several clergymen who have become liable to the draft. Father Connor's suit against the Geneva Selective Service board is one of three in which the council has joined.

The Council will support also ACLU suits on behalf of the Rev. Paul Gibbons, chaplain for the United Ministry at Cornell, and the Rev. Henry Bucher, field director of the University Christian Movement, and NCC staff members.

Those who protest, he declared, "have a great love for America, and we believe in the fairness and the sense of justice of the American people. We are confident that if we can face the courts, we will be vindicated."

Other Catholic, Protestant and Jewish churchmen spoke at the service, held at the request of The Resistance, a loose, organized student group. As a climax, 86 men marched up the center aisle to deposit their draft cards in an alms basin. The cards were sent to the Justice Department by the pastor, the Rev. Richard J. Neuhaus.

In a recent comment on anti-draft demonstrations, Selective Service Director Lewis B. Hershey said that The Resistance had turned in more bogus draft cards than real ones. He said a demonstration in Washington had produced 297 genuine cards in an aggregate of 996.
