# Language Squabble in India

Panjim, India — (NC) — Valerian Cardinal Gracias of Bombay has warned that if India's people do not find a way to end the controversy over an official language, the nation will go down to the road to - WETTING THE anarchy.

The cardinal spoke at the Menezes Braganza Institute .here against a background of oriots and attacks on Catholic schools by partisans who favor Hindi as the nation's sole of ficial language. The violence was prompted by introduction of a bill in the national-parliament, which would continue recognition of English along with Hindi as an official language.

The outbreaks have affected, among others, the nation's Catholic schools, most of which use English as the language of unstruction.



As a parent of two teenagers, I have been rather upset by some of the low quality and definitely B-grade movies that have recently been slipped into the A category as either A-4's or A-3's in the ratings of the N.C.O.M.P. I have begun to lose faith in the N.C.O.M.P. and now wonder how a parent can judge both the moral and technical quality of the movies that are being produced today.

It is true that the Nationa Catholic Office for Motion Pic-tures (N.C.O.M.P.) has in the past couple years liberalized its standards at least to the extent that a number of movies which has formerly been classified as B have now been reclassified as A-3 or A-4. However, we feel that this is a necessary develop ment on the part of N.C.O.M.P.: for as people's attitudes concerning what is acceptable in a motion picture change, so-too the standards for appraising these films must also change. Whereas thirty years ago the mere presence of the word "damm" in a movie could cause an uproar, today no one would even bat an eve at such an occurence. While taking into account obvious limits, standards must reflect the times. The N.C.O.M.P. has made a start in this direction, and we would like to see it continue.

Now, concerning your problem, there are several points that should be mentioned.

First of all, a rating A-3 or A4 means "for adults" and "for very mature adults" respectively. These ratings are beginning to mean exactly what they say Gone are the days when most





She organized a Little League club of some 130 children who regularly pray for and write to the soldiers.




