Fisher Dorm Dedicated

Bishop James E. Kearney, chancellor of St. John Fisher College, will dedicate Murray Hall, a new 54-man residence, at 4:30 this afternoon (Jan. 12).

Ceremonies will consist of a Mass in the campus chapel offered by Bishop Kearney; blessing of the new building, and a reception by the college for several years. The building named for him will be dedicated on the ninth anniversary of his death.

Dr. Murray, a native Rochesterian, was an assistant professor of history at the college for several years. The building named for him will be dedicated on the ninth anniversary of his death.

Murray Hall is the first of a four-unit student housing complex at Fisher designed to provide a "family" atmosphere not possible in larger dormitories. The two-man rooms cluster around a central lounge area on the upper two stories of the three-level brick structure. Construction cost was \$420,000.

Science Award For Local Prof

Ljubomir Matulic, assistant professor of physics at St. John Fisher College, has been awarded a one-year Science Faculty Fellowship at the University of Rochester by the National Science Foundation.

The grant, which pays a stipend of \$11,900, plus tuition, will enable Matulic to complete work on his doctorate in quantum optics at the university. He will begin his year of full-time studies there in September.

Interracial Council Appoint Public Information Head

Chicago — Don Rose, editor and publicist, has been appointed public information director of the National Catholic Conference for Interracial Justice and its Project Equality program, announced Mathew Ahmann, NCCIJ executive director.

Project Equality is an interdenominational effort sponsored by the Conference to harness the purchasing power of religious institutions behind equal employment opportunities for minorities. Directed by Thomas H. Gibbons, Jr., it is supported in part by a recently announced Ford Foundation grant.

Rose formerly headed the publications department of Public Administration Service here, a consulting firm in the field of government.

For the past five years he has served in a voluntary capacity as public information chairman of the Coordinating Council of Community Organizations, the local civil rights federation and for the Chicago Freedom Movement led by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and Al Raby.

His CCO major projects such as the 1966 open housing marches, Chicago's two school boycotts and several large civil rights rallies.

The NCCIJ, founded in 1960, serves 150 Catholic human relations organizations, including 29 in the South. It works to end racial discrimination and to foster interracial justice and equal opportunity in all aspects of life.
