Elmira - Notre Dame's basketballers had a big week last week, racking up three wins over Corning West, Southside and Sayre. The victories brought the Crusaders' season mark to 10-2.

Amie Westervelt's 25 points paced a cakewalk over Corning West 93-33, early in the week. He was abetted by Tom Russell, Paul Bussell and John Heher, with outputs of 19, 18 and 13, respectively. West's John Tackett was good for 27.

A 21-point last quarter made the difference in the Southside game. The Green Hornets of Southside led by Mark Brotzman's 22 counters, made a fought fight of it, before bowing, however.

Last Saturday night, the Crusaders downed Sayre, at the Pennsylvanians' home court, 68-66. Bussell led the winners with 20 points, including 10 for 10 at the foul line. Russell and Westervelt had 15 and 10 for Notre Dame, respectively.

The Crusaders go after win No. 11 against Corning East next Tuesday, Jan. 31, at Notre Dame.

The Cardinals whipped the Canadian five in Toronto, on Dec. 16, 89-68. The annual home-and-home contests between the two Basilian colleges continues the earliest athletic rivalry established at Fisher.

Coach Bobby Warner's youngsters, now 44 for the season, surprised Brockport State in the opening round of the county tourney on the Golden Eagles' court, avenging an earlier defeat suffered at home. In the championship event against Roberts Wesleyan, however, Fisher ran out of gas in the second half to lose by a 15-point spread after rallying late in the opening period to tie the powerful Raiders at halftime. Billy O'Rourke of the Cardinal squad was named to the tournament all-star team.

Fisher will meet Geneseo State here Jan. 31 and then will not play at home again until Feb. 20.

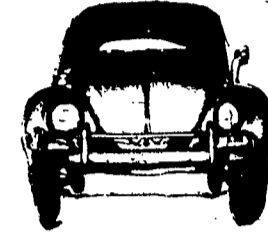
