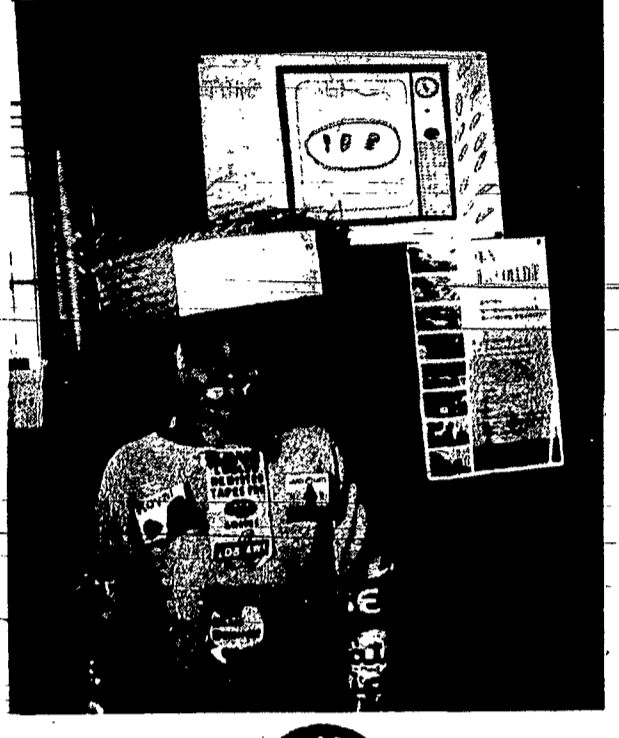


# POP TOPICS

- POP Fasnacht Kueckels**
- 2 envelopes of Red Star Yeast
  - 1/4 cup lukewarm water
  - 1 cup milk
  - 1/2 cup shortening
  - 1/2 cup sugar
  - 1 tsp. salt
  - 2 eggs beaten
  - 1 tsp. vanilla
  - 5 cups flour
  - 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
  - Melted shortening
  - Confectioners' sugar

Dissolve Red Star Yeast in water. Set aside. Heat shortening with milk until melted. When lukewarm add sugar, salt, eggs, vanilla and dissolved yeast. Mix well. To this, add flour and nutmeg which have been sifted together. Mix well. Cover and let rise until double in bulk, about 5 hours. Roll out on floured board to 1/4 inch thickness and cut in triangular shapes. Let rise again about 2 hours. Fry in deep melted shortening until brown on both sides. Roll warm kueckels in confectioners' sugar.

## Bishop Appoints Cursillo Leaders

Bishop Fulton J. Sheen has elevated the Cursillo Movement to its fully intended status by appointing four priests and six laymen to a diocesan secretariat.

As the highest governing body for Cursillo in the diocese, the secretariat will be directly responsible to the bishop.

Father Hugh F. Brady, assistant pastor at St. Anne's Church, Hornell, will be the secretariat's spiritual director.

When Bishop Sheen approved Cursillo for the diocese a year ago, he picked Father Brady to guide its growth and development. Since then, about 25 men and women have been assisting with laying the foundation for the movement.

Three other priests were selected to serve as assistant spiritual directors. They are Father John G. Skvorak, assistant pastor at St. Francis Xavier Parish; Father Edwin Metzger of St. Bernard's Seminary; and Father Peter Duggan of the Carmelite Monastery at Waverly.

Other lay officers named by the bishop are: Daniel G. DePalma, mother of Sorrows parish, to be president of the new Cursillo secretariat.

Vice president, Albert P. Bergeron, Christ the King parish, secretary, Dr. Therese G. Lynch, St. Jerome's Parish, treasurer, Robert J. Fien, St. Louis Parish, women's representative, Miss Ruth A. Page, St. John's the Evangelist Parish, Ridge Road West, and men's representative, Gordon W. Dawes Jr., Blessed Sacrament Parish.

Cursillo is a movement for Christian renewal open to priests, religious, laymen and laywomen. It is probably best known for its three-day weekend of spiritual talks, discussions and prayer which give participants a dramatic awareness of the presence of Christ in their lives and in the world.

The main thrust of Cursillo, however, occurs in the follow-up program. Cursillistas, those who have made a Cursillo, are encouraged to preserve and strengthen their new, close relationship with Christ through prayer and study.

Cursillo further assists them in taking roles of apostolic leadership in their families, at work, among neighbors and in the community. The aim is to make the spirit of Christ better known and understood.

The Diocesan Secretariat will have charge of committees which select candidates, put on the Cursillo weekend, and carry out the Post-Cursillo program of continued spiritual formation.

The next Cursillo in English will be held on the weekend of April 18 at McQuaid Jesuit High School.

All laymen, priests and religious who are interested in joining the Cursillo Movement, are urged to contact their pastors.

The Cursillo Movement was founded in 1949 on the island of Majorca in the Mediterranean Sea, off the coast of Spain. Two Spanish air cadets introduced Cursillo to the United States in 1957 at Lackland Air Force Base, Waco, Texas.

The first Cursillo in English was held in 1961 at San Angelo, Texas. Since 1957, the movement has spread to 105 dioceses or more than two-thirds of the 147 dioceses in the United States.

The first Cursillo in the Rochester Diocese was for Spanish-speaking people. It was held last spring at St. Patrick's Church. Father Roger Baglin is spiritual director for the Spanish group.

Rochester's first English-speaking Cursillo was held last Thanksgiving weekend at McQuaid Jesuit High with the assistance of a Cursillo team from the Buffalo Diocese.

### Workshop Lists

#### Father Curran

Father Charles Curran, Rochester priest teaching theology at Catholic University in Washington, will be the principal speaker at a religious education workshop arranged by the Catechetical Society of St. Bernard's Seminary.

All interested persons are invited to the sessions, scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 17, from 7 until 10 p.m., and Sunday, Feb. 18, from 1 to 5. Clerical, professional and lay points of view will be presented in seminars on various phases of religious education.

### Monsignor Roche To Speak at Mooney

Monsignor William M. Roche, diocesan superintendent of schools, will speak at 8 p.m. Monday, at Cardinal Mooney auditorium in a program on the future of Catholic education.

Other speakers will be Miss Alice Foley, director of instruction for the Brighton Central District, and Gardner Wales, president of the Catholic Education Congress. A discussion period will follow.

The meeting is sponsored by the Greece Association of Catholic Administrators, a group organized last year by the school principals and pastors.

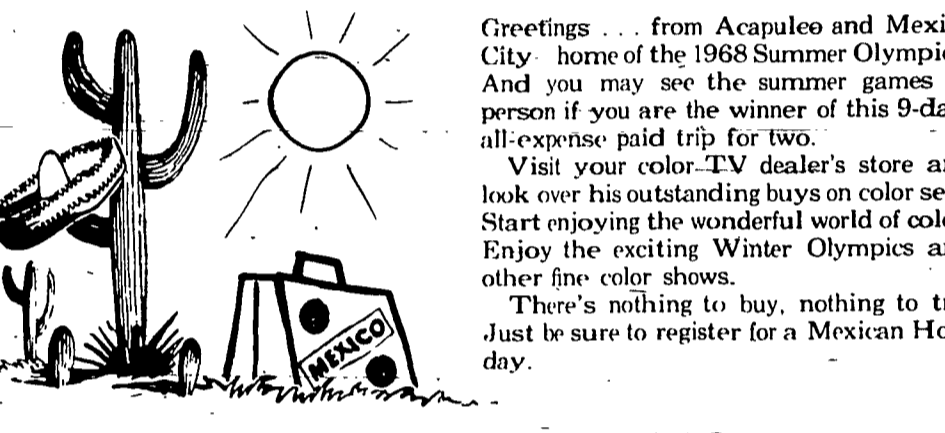
