McQuaid Top Cage The basketball Knights of McQuaid put the talents of their 6-4 center, Nick Combs, to good use at the War Memorial last Saturday and topped the Little Irish of Aquinas for the second time this season, 52-37. Cardinal Mooney's high-flying cagers stopped Kearney High in the other half of the twin bill, 53 to 38, to run their record to a gaudy 11-1 count. The Cards lead the Catholic High School league with a 4-1 record, with McQuaid second at 3-1. Aquinas third and 1-3 and Kearney trailing with an 0-1 league record. Against Aquinas, the Knight started fast as Bob Madde clicked on a 3-point play just 3 seconds after the opening tap. Madden had the Knight's first 5 points, but Jim Brad fired back for Aquinas and put the Irish in front for the only time in the game at 7-5. Combs going then, hitting for inside for 3 buckets and a foul to give McQuaid a 12-9 lead at the quarter. McQuaid's tough defense and Aquinas' ability to find the basket over the next 10 minutes saw the score mount to 35-23 with Combs providing 11 more points in that stretch. A drive by Brady at the outset of the last quarter narrowed the margin to 10 points, but the Irish got no closer, and McQuaid's bench took over for the final 2 minutes of play. Combs finished with 5 points, 9 of them at the free throw line, while Madden had 10. Brady was the only Aquinas man in double figures, with 11. Mooney's well balanced attack was too much for the Kearney quint in the opening game. Except for one strong Kearney thrust in the third period Mooney was in command all the way. The Kings drew within three points then, b
